WE ARE HERE FOR

Rev. Markey's quote from Bob Marley's, "Three Little Birds" (see next page) in this month's witness has inspired me. So, here is a Bob Marley quote that resonates with me, from "Redemption Songs".

"Emancipate yourselves from mental slavery, none but ourselves can free our minds."

Seems pretty works based, doesn't it? Is that Biblical? Well, it was written by a Rastafarian, so no. But it is still useful in our time. In the post covid church the question is often asked, "what is the church going to do?" Or, "what are we going to do now that the world has changed?"

I believe that a better question would be a simple change. "What am I going to do?" While corporate worship, and the family of God are critically important, there is and always has been an individual responsibility when it comes to our faith. It is true that only God, and not any of us as individuals can save a soul, it is also true that we each have to make a choice. In a changing world, what will each of us do? Will we choose to follow? Will we choose to be a part of God's salvific plan? Will we choose to "free our minds," by walking in truth instead of becoming captives of the "mental slavery" of fear and worry that are ever present around us?

Joshua 24:15, "As for me and my house, we will serve the LORD."

Choose to serve. It is your choice to make. It is a path to freedom and peace in a frightening future,

and it is a choice you will be glad to have made when you look back on this moment, after today becomes tomorrow's yesterday.

I hope that you are having a beautiful start to your summer. In spite of a world that continues to churn and writhe in turmoil and turnult. I encourage each of us to remember God's promise that our future is secure in Him.

Admittedly, I find it so easy to try and apply this passage from Jeremiah as a sort of promise of prosperity just for me - a sort of Marlevian doctrine of "every little thing being all right." While this thinking might prove true, depending on one's interpretation of "all right," I must concede that often my desire for my "troubles" to dissipate simply because "that's what God said He'd do" is more than a little misguided. Leaning on the assurances proclaimed in this passage of Scripture without context can leave one feeling discouraged, because the context reminds us that "all right" doesn't always alian with "without issues."

Being secure in a hopeful future with Christ is not a promise that we will live comfortably, or even that we will be free from harm. In fact, Scripture often serves as a reminder that choosing to walk with Christ will not always

Where's the "welfare" and lack of harm? Where then is this "future with hope?" What we DO get from this passage of assurance is a reminder that in all things God is in control. He sees tomorrow as clearly as He remembers yesterday, and He has promised us a future beyond the ephemeral struggles we face in our time in this life. We serve a God who has borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows. He knows every pain of this world, and is acutely aware of the context of every moment of every life. Alpha and Omega, God is with us as we each walk our path, and even though He knows the full extent of our journeys, He hears our prayers with divine empathy and genuine care.

I serve a God who has called me to be his child, in good times and times of struggle. I trust that God sees the challenges I face, and is patiently guiding me through them through the Holy Spirit. The eternal assurance of a future with hope has much to offer how we can conduct ourselves in the present. God Loves us. God cares deeply what happens to us, in the mountains and valleys that we all traverse, and in our ultimate destination of an eternity found with Christ. Jeremiah 29:11 and countless other reminders in the Bible assure us that even though things aren't always going our way, we are called to press forward, remembering the strength we are given today can be found in the bright hope for tomorrow.
