Later in August, our church will host an event that is shaping up to be a one-stop shop for any needs that unemployed former mill workers may have. Working with several partners, those in need will be able to get questions answered, bypass some red tape, and find ways to access the help their families may need. As more news comes out about the event, I hope you will consider volunteering, even if it is something as simple as getting the word out or setting up chairs. Small gestures are immeasurably potent, even if they do not seem to be at the time.

There have been more surprises this summer. For instance, have you noticed the uptick in visitors over the summer? Our church has been host to new faces, often many of them, almost every week since school released. This is wonderful news! I hope that the welcoming and loving nature that I felt from you when I first met you is alive and well. From what I can see from the stage, it is, but I will remind you anyway. Welcome newcomers as our loving God and our savior welcomes us. We may not be used to seeing

new faces over the summer, when most of the world's population is at the lake, but, by the grace of God, it is happening. Let us give thanks in the form of love to strangers, and let us imitate our savior by welcoming the outsiders to become insiders. I've always loved choir. Ever since I was very young, I've enjoyed singing, and the safety one feels from singing as a group. I sang all the way through school, but it was in high school when I really began to fully understand that choir was about more than just the music; it was community. Through my time singing, traveling, and spending time in choir I developed some of the deepest, most meaningful memories and relationships that I continue to cherish to this day.

Music can be found throughout scripture. It's often described as a form of praise and worship. The Psalms, for instance, repeatedly encourage us to shout and sing to express our joys, sorrows, and ultimately our devotion to our Almighty God. We're encouraged to sing when we're alone and together as we seek to elevate our worship experiences.

Singing in choir as a collection of individuals is in many ways a reflection of the spiritual mandate of Christians in general. Paul describes the church as "...a body, though one, has many parts, but all its many parts form one body, so it is with Christ. For we were all baptized by one Spirit so as to form one body—whether Jews or Gentiles, slave or free—and we were all given the one Spirit to drink. 14 Even so the body is not made up of one part but of many." [1 Cor. 12:12-14] In this way, our choir exists as a collection of folks committed to one another in making a joyful noise to proudly express our faith, and supporting one another's spiritual journey.

On August 2 at 6pm, the choir will resume its weekly schedule. We're meeting an hour earlier that week than our usual 7pm rehearsal time so we can share a meal and catch up. Following supper, we will head to the choir room to preview this year's Christmas cantata. As you consider the direction that God is leading you in the coming seasons, remember that we're always holding a place for you in the choir room. Every voice matters, and each note we sing with intention and devotion has the power to proclaim the Glory of God and the potential to touch hearts and stir the spirit of a world that needs to hear a message of Good News. Remember: there's safety in numbers, and you couldn't ask for a sweeter, more loving group of folks to hang out with.
