This is a God who is consistent, but consistently relevant, and not limited to what God has done in the past. I hope you will join me in celebrating what God is doing, and hoping with excitement that we are present and involved in what God will do tomorrow.

Speaking of celebrating what God is doing, do not forget your role. We can celebrate that God is using us to minister to our community. We have been able to help lots of people. We have been able to add quite a few too. 
