Trials Finding out that you are pregnant can cause a considerable number of emotions to erupt. For some, it's pure joy. For others, despair.

For Danielle, feelings of nervousness and fear of how her life would change were pulsating through her mind one morning. At 18, Danielle didn't know where to turn. She decided to come to Modesto Pregnancy Center knowing that she might be pregnant, and immediately felt loved and comforted by the staff and volunteers.

Danielle decided to raise her child and immediately started coming to the incentive program classes where she could earn diapers and clothing for her soon-to-be little bundle. She looked forward to seeing Paige, her class teacher, each week and quickly formed a relationship with her. Danielle says that she has so much love and respect for Paige and that Paige has taught her not only valuable information on becoming a mom, but also that God is always on her side. Danielle now understands that she can pray wherever she is and God will be there to listen.

Danielle's little sweetheart, Sophia, is now 7 months old (pictured below with Danielle, left and Paige, right). Danielle says "Sophia has changed my life for the good in so many different ways. She has taught me how to have so much patience. She has motivated me to get back in school and strive for my high school diploma. She made me a responsible parent and

she is the reason I wake up with a smile on my face each morning. My life changed forever the moment I saw those two lines on the pregnancy test. I look at my daughter and sometimes cry because I know how blessed I am to be her mother. She was the greatest gift God could have ever blessed me with."

Ultrasound Training Support

Many woman justify planning an abortion because they think, in early pregnancy, there is just a blob of tissue growing inside them. Even those who acknowledge that being pregnant means having a human life growing inside them can dismiss that fact because they have not yet seen their baby. Providing ultrasound examinations for our clients allows them to see firsthand the head, arms, legs, and heartbeat of the human life, *their baby*, growing inside them. Often this view of their baby, through ultrasound, "turns the light on" in their head and they have a change of heart about abortion, realizing it will end their baby's life.

We currently have two nurses trained in limited first trimester ultrasound and have a few other RNs interested in obtaining that specific training. Do you feel led to sponsor some of that training? The training consists of a 4 day, hands-on training session and those of us who are already trained would receive a review as well. The minimum cost is \$5500.00 for three new RNs, plus \$750 each for a fourth or fifth nurse. Please join us in an effort through prayer, and if you feel led through financial support, to save these babies from losing their young lives to abortion; and prevent the emotional aftermath many postabortive women experience.
