"Sanctity of Human Life"...Catchphrase or Conviction?

Most Christians would at least give lip service to the idea that human life is sacred. Indeed, after a generation of fighting over issues such as abortion, stem cells, and euthanasia, "the sanctity of life" has become a slogan wielded by many Christians as justification for their positions. But sometimes little thought goes into that slogan. It is assumed that "everyone" knows what "sanctity of life" means. Yet the concept is actually much more complex in its origins and its implications than is commonly understood. And it won't be sufficient for Christians to continue mouthing a slogan without thinking through what it means and how it really affects our worldview.

So what is the sanctity of human life? Should Christians of all stripes assert it and in what ways? Or should we abandon the term as either politically motivated or too limited in its application? On the contrary, I believe that the sanctity of human life is not simply a slogan, but an extraordinarily rich and important Christian moral conviction that has far wider implications than most of us realize. The belief that each and every human being has an inviolable dignity and immeasurable worth is one of the most precious legacies of biblical faith to the world. It profoundly elevates the way human beings view and treat one another. It restrains the darkest impulses that course within our fallen nature. Every day for millennia it has both saved lives and enriched their quality. Indeed, it provides the bedrock upon which the moral and legal codes of our culture and much of the world have been built.

For these reasons it is a concept worth protecting.

Untold volunteer hours of manual labor coupled with many materials purchased at cost made the dream of moving into our own building by July a reality. Financially, God's people gave beyond my wildest dreams. The Knights of Columbus raised the money to purchase a new sonogram machine with the capability of hearing the heartbeat.

Our Community Education program got a new name, "Exposed: revealing the facts about sexuality" and is expanding into more schools, reaching 5,852 students last school year. Katie, our community education director, hosted a six-hour training for eight centers from northern California and Nevada. Our conference room was packed!

Client services increased as we served 974 people.

As we "dream" for 2012, we wonder, "Can it get any better than this?" There is much work still to be done in this community where 25% of students in high school don't graduate. Why? Where does MPC fit into this picture?

"You've changed my philosophy about sex." This was the response Julie and I received from a local high school teacher after spending four days in his classroom discussing the impact of sex outside of marriage with his students.

Julie and I entered his classroom the first morning and he briefly introduced us to the class, "This is Katie and Julie from the Modesto Pregnancy Center. They're here to give you their philosophy on this topic." Interesting, I thought, our "philosophy". It was an introduction I had never heard before, but I realize not everyone agrees with truth.

So I continued on as I would normally, discussing media influence, setting standards for dating, consequences of sex in dating relationships, the importance of physical boundaries, etc. Julie and I came back the following day to complete our discussion on abstinence and relationships. The third and forth days we spent talking to students about fetal development and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and after dismissal, just as we were leaving, this teacher approached us and said

I do not know how well these slogans motivated people but I have no objection in plagiarizing them looking for male volunteers down here at the Center. There is no greater army than God's Army.


