This is the Facebook response we got from Cory Simpson, a teacher at one of our newest program additions, Dan Savage Middle School. We had such a great time in his classes and were so encouraged by his active support. After our presentation, Cory offered his students extra credit if they would take our "Exposed" booklet home, share the information with their parents, and return the packet with a parent's signature. As speakers, we interact with many teachers and rarely do we receive any negative feedback or hesitation about our message; however, it is also rare to have a teacher so proactive, enthusiastic, and equally as passionate about what we share in the classroom. It was such a treat for Julie and I and we are definitely looking forward to going back next year!

Along with our great experience at Savage, in total we had the opportunity to give 35 presentations, (nine more than we gave last April), and to speak to 1,083 students, (305 more than we spoke to last April)! So exciting! To make it even more exciting, four of these locations were brand new for us: Dan Savage Middle School, Ustach Middle School, River Oak Grace Junior High Youth Group, and River Oak Grace High School Youth Group.

I remember the sense of overwhelm and anxiety I felt at the beginning of spring semester, wondering how in the world we would be able to accommodate all the schools, organizations, and churches requesting presentations. In comparison to last year, our number of volunteer speakers has stayed the same, there are no additional hours in the day, or days in the week and yet in the past four months we have been able to give 140 presentations and speak to over 3,474 students! That's a 27% increase in presentations and a 52% increase in students from last year!

Although it can be difficult for me to comprehend, I found my answer when looking at Revelation 3:8, "I know your deeds. See, I have placed before you an open door that no one can shut. I know that you have little strength, yet you have kept my word and have not denied my name." What a great reminder that when we are working for the Lord, He finds a way! God has opened these doors and in His faithfulness, has given us the strength, the energy, and the time to walk through each of them! Praise be to God and glory to His name for His provisions and favor on our program!

Recently, we had the opportunity to counsel with two women who were headed for an abortion but instead were sent here by a sidewalk counselor in front of Family Planning. Family Planning performs abortions on Tuesdays and Wednesdays and is located six blocks south of us. We administered the pregnancy test, counseled them, gave them information on their options, and performed an ultrasound. Both of them are now choosing to give life to their precious unborn babies!! Praise God!

The younger couple was 18 years old and both were shocked to find out that the young woman was almost 20 weeks pregnant! What an awesome ultrasound that was! We could see the rib cage, the spine, the hands pushing against the uterine wall - it was amazing! They are now considering an adoption plan. Please keep them in your prayers, as they prepare to share their situation with their parents. Although they are a very mature couple, they expressed concern over this upcoming conversation.
