Praising God for His Provision

"How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy we have in the presence of our God because of you?" I Thessalonians 3:9

In March 2010, the Modesto Pregnancy Center sent a letter to you, our donors and supporters, inviting you to participate in an extraordinary opportunity. In spite of the deep recession and hard economic times that gripped our region, God seemed to be calling MPC to acquire a building of its own, strategically located just a few blocks away from one of the most active abortion clinics in Central California. Girded by constant prayer and petition for the Lord's guidance and provision, MPC embarked on an ambitious capital building campaign to raise the funds needed for the acquisition, remodeling, and equipping of 2801 Coffee Road, Suite A5. From the very outset, it was pledged that the capital building campaign would remain completely separate and in no way drain the general funding for MPC's critical mission – saving babies and ministering to those experiencing unplanned pregnancies.

In the months that followed that first letter, the Lord repeatedly proved to all those connected with the building
project that when He leads His people forth, He WILL provide and equip. Through your specifically designated donations, countless hours of volunteer labor, and gifts of building materials at cost or below-cost prices, God's people answered His
call. Every board meeting became a time of praise and worship as we marveled at what was being accomplished. In July
2011, MPC opened for ministry in its new home, a full six months earlier than predicted.

Now, almost three years exactly from the sending of that very first letter, it is with profound awe and humility the Board of Directors for the Modesto Pregnancy Center announces that, as of March 7, 2013, MPC's capital building campaign is complete! An exceedingly generous estate bequest and 2012 year-end donations have allowed the outstanding mortgage to be retired, with only minimal input from the general fund. Ever mindful of the seriousness of our responsibility to be excellent stewards of our donors' support, the board felt the most prudent use of these unexpected gifts was in paying off the mortgage, thus saving tens of thousands of dollars in interest payments over the course of the next 15 years. In Psalm 127, King Solomon says, "Unless the Lord build the house, they labor in vain who build it;...Behold, children are a gift of the Lord; the fruit of the womb is a reward." The Lord has so graciously built this new home for the Modesto Pregnancy Center, please pray that within its walls, we will continue to have the ability and opportunity to speak the truth and reveal the blessing of the gift of children to those involved in unplanned pregnancies. Moments like these make it all worth it... This past semester Holly and I were on the campus of one of Modesto's larger high schools giving Abstinence presentations to their freshman class of 350 students. We were hanging out in the classroom between periods watching the usual flow of students hustling from one class to the next when a very familiar face walked in and greeted us each with a big smile. This young man, although in a hurry to get to his next period, explained that he had the opportunity to hear our presentation the year before (hence the familiar face) and since hearing our presentation had his wallet stolen which contained the abstinence Gift Card we had given to him.

Each student receives this Gift Card at the end of our presentation. This gives them the opportunity to make a commitment to remain sexually pure until marriage, keeping the Gift Card as a reminder which one day they can pass on to their future spouse. This young man heard that we were back on campus and searched us out in hopes that we would have an extra Gift Card to replace the one that was stolen with his wallet.

Now, this may not seem life-changing to most, but when considering the mind frame and priorities of a typical high school boy, it's unexpected. Knowing that the commitment he made to abstinence his freshman year was important enough for him to seek us out a year later speaks volumes! Aside from the incredible interactions we have had with students throughout the greater Modesto area, God is clearly at work within our Community Education Program. He is opening doors left and right, and allowing us the opportunity to speak with groups we had never even considered.

> Our program continues to grow; over the past three years we have seen a 45% increase in the number of students we have been able to reach (3,805 students in 2009 to 6,956 students in 2012) and a 50% increase in the number of presentations that have been given (162 presentations in 2009 to 326 presentations in 2012)! Praise God for His favor, His faithfulness, and His provisions in allowing us to accommodate each of the presentations that has been requested of us! Be encouraged and excited about what God is doing and will continue to do within the Community Education Program of Modesto Pregnancy Center!
