FROM BAD TO WORSE

Most of you will remember that Nepal was devastated by two earthquakes this past spring. Those who lost their homes have made shelters, usually out of tin roofing, and gotten on with their lives. There is still a good bit of rebuilding to do in the villages. Compounding the challenges everyone is facing in Nepal to survive, the government finally signed a new constitution. But instead of that propelling the country forward, it has sent it reeling backward due to India (unofficially) blocking the entry of trucks carrying vital fuel and food.

One local woman said, "It's even worse than the earthquake - because during the natural calamity there was a unity that took the country forward. During this fuel crisis, we feel helpless as we are in this spot because of our corrupt politicians." We have heard it said that one of the reasons India is doing this is because the Nepal Assembly voted to remain a secular country (with religious freedom) instead of going back to a Hindu state.

Things in Kathmandu are slowly getting back to "normal." There are still gas lines and not as much traffic as usual, but more shops are open now. We wonder how far the politicians on both sides are going to go in allowing this suffering to continue. Your prayers for this deteriorating situation are appreciated.


Our U.S. Address 14811 54th Pl W Edmonds, WA 98026 village and the progress being made there.

We also saw the site where the church will be relocated. The old church site that collapsed in the earthquake will also be rebuilt, so there will be two churches on this mountainside.




Corn harvest was good in the village.
