The word lent comes from the old English word meaning "to lengthen" and it names the time of the year when (in the Northern Hemisphere), the days begin to get longer and warmer. As people begin to feel renewal and re-creation again following the hibernation and drowsy days of winter even so the church stirs into action for renewal in the season of Lent.

Karen Armstrong won the 2008 TED Prize. Her wish asked the TED organization to help her assemble the Charter for Compassion, a document around which religious leaders can work together for peace. In late fall 2008, the first draft of the document was written by the world, via a sharing website. In February 2009 the world were collected and given to the Council of Conscience, a gathering of religious leaders and thinkers, who crafted the final document. The Charter was launched in November 2009.



In my family, I was never told "I love you." Nor did I ever say those words—to my parents, sisters, or friends. It was not through any lack of affection, I think, but rather the times. It simply was not something that one commonly did. Verbal expressions of love seemed to be reserved for romantic situations. Even so, I never doubted that I was loved.

My dad, being totally involved in our family business, a hard worker, and an early-riser, quite often was the one who fixed my breakfast, giving my mom the chance for a bit of extra sleep in the mornings. I could count on hot cereal, or often, a fried egg, over easy, along with small sausages and thickly buttered slices of warm toast. I could also count on his telling me bedtime stories, which he made up as he went, nearly every night when I was in grade school. He seemed to believe in, and adhere to the rite of passage, buying me a 410 shotgun when I turned 12 and a set of water skies when I became 21. This in a family where gifts were always reserved for only special occasions and were rarely extravagant. A kind and gentle man, he led by example and was strict in his expectations for what was acceptable behavior.

My mom was my closest friend and confidante when I was young. She always listened patiently to my endless chatter and gave me plenty to think about when she reprimanded me for wrongdoing. She worked full-time at our family business next door, fixed meals from scratch every single day, and sewed many of my clothes and dance costumes for recitals. She was supportive and encouraging in my myriad interests, including raising rabbits and collecting bugs. She was quiet, compassionate, and patiently explained her beliefs to me whenever appropriate. She was my role model.

In today's world, we more often hear those words of affection, freely expressed. While I think that is a good thing, it's not necessary as an expression of how much you care for someone. I so value the many small acts of kindness that I observe and experience every single day: A call or card from someone on a special day or just to let you know you're being thought of; being included in a conversation; being offered a ride when you'd rather not drive yourself; being invited for a cup of coffee or a meal; being embraced when you really need it and words fail...

In times of transition, trouble and/or chaos, it's reassuring to know that there are so many good, loving people in the world, who offer a great many expressions of their love to others. Words are fine, but they certainly don't tell the whole story.

Vinland Lutheran's Involvement with Martha and Mary

Currently there are two Vinland-based members of the Board of Trustees – Aaron Schielke and Bobbie Moore. The trustees meet monthly on the last Thursday of the month, except that usually the November and December meetings are combined.

There are also three Vinland 'Delegates' – Terry Beaudoin, Rebecca Moore, and Beachie Settle. Their function is to represent Vinland as one of 8 Lutheran congregations who provide an additional layer of governance for Martha & Mary. Delegates attend the Martha & Mary annual meeting, which occurs April 30 this year. At that meeting delegates vote on broad issues affecting the organization and must approve major transactions involving real estate (as an example.)

Delegates are required to attend the annual meeting and by choice attend educational sessions that help Martha & Mary connect with both the 8 congregations and with the community. Trustees and delegates are invited to an orientation about Martha & Mary on March 14 in the morning, for example.

Staff from Martha & Mary will be making a presentation at the Vinland men's breakfast on March 7, addressing questions about long-term care, which is increasingly important to all of us.
