

## barb's backyard

The pictures are haunting, bringing back memories as clear as yesterday. Online, I scan the map of the carnage, reading the names of roads I drove many times and follow the once-familiar route home. Although the satellite map is not crystal clear, I'm sure of the location. The imposed red marker leaves no doubt: **DESTROYED**. Our home is gone.

Of course, it's not ours anymore and the structure we called home probably had been replaced some time ago. It's been forty years since we lived there and things change. But had we stayed, our home there would have been destroyed - burned to the ground. Of course, the house we live in today could likewise be gone tomorrow. It's not a welcome thought...

The recent fires in Black Forest, Colorado have stirred up all sorts of memories of our time spent there so long ago. We'd been married three years when Bill accepted a job in Colorado Springs; we packed our meager belongings and headed south. We could not afford much, but in that respect the house fit the bill: cement slab, log siding, tacked-on kitchen a foot lower than the rest of the house, one gas heater, no clothes dryer nor any room for one. But the setting was spectacular - five acres of Ponderosa pines with a clear view of the Rocky Mountain front and Pike's Peak. We were young, ambitious, and full of enthusiasm.

We set about making this ramshackle cabin into a home and there were a lot of challenges. The well was so shallow that after one load of washing we had to wait for it to recover. Laundry was hung outside in summer, in front of the heater in winter. We replaced a ceiling, only to have the mice store food up there. Prying loose the seats of our built-in eating area, we discovered their droppings were an inch thick inside. We nailed wood paneling over electric outlets by accident and needed to knock a hole in the wall to replace the bath tub because the room was too small to remove it any other way. A hail storm destroyed the roof. With new shutters, window boxes, and fresh paint, the outside looked much better. But, fearing tornados, previous owners had built a concrete shelter in front of the house - not much we could do to improve the looks of that. We spent four years working on that place; looking back, it never really did amount to much but it was ours and we loved it.

Living in the woods of Colorado, we learned to live with inconvenience and make the best of it. We got to know each other: learned to discuss ideas, compromise, reach agreement, and reconcile our differences. Having a great many dreams, but little money, we were challenged to be creative. Sometimes the results were quite nice. Other times, not so much. But it didn't really matter because whatever we achieved, we achieved together. We operated on faith and trust.

We can never go back and the devastation is heart-breaking, but we will forever carry that little house in our hearts. Surely the people we are today were molded in part by our efforts to make a home there.

But godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into the world, and we can take nothing out of it. But if we have food and clothing, we will be content with that. 1 Timothy 6: 6-8




**Return to Two Services** September 15



## synod assembly



#### The 26th Annual Assembly of the SW Washington Synod of

**the ELCA** was held in Tacoma June 7-8. *Bill Brueggemann, Sharon Schmid,* and *Pastor Chuck* represented Vinland as voting delegates.

The main business of this meeting was to elect a new Bishop. *Pastor Rob Hofstad*, who has been serving as Bishop for 12 years, had announced his retirement. The Bishop is elected for 6 years.

The process was very spiritual and satisfying, with Bible study and time

for private and pastor-led prayer before voting. The first morning, voting members cast ballots for a new Bishop – this process allows for <u>no</u> nominations ahead of time. There were almost 300 voting members and 46 names were put forth. Each nominee has 3 hours to withdraw their name (woe to those nominated, not in attendance, who would not be willing to serve). After lunch we cast our 2<sup>nd</sup> ballot for a slimmed down list of 14 names.

The  $2^{nd}$  morning we received biographical information on 7 surviving candidates and heard each of them speak to the assembly. We voted the  $3^{rd}$  ballot and eliminated the 4 who got the least votes. The  $5^{th}$  and  $6^{th}$  ballot was preceded by each candidate answering 2 questions. Since no clear majority was proven with these ballots, we had a  $7^{th}$  ballot between the top 2 candidates.

Crucial to our combined ministry is to continuously sink our roots deeper into the presence and love of God through worship, community-building and prayer.

I'm proud to announce our new bishop is *Pastor Richard Jaech* from Vancouver, Washington. He stated in his biographical profile:

As bishop, I would guide our congregations and ministries through a process of honest evaluation, planning and mutual support: "Who are we? What are our gifts and passions? What's working and what's not working in our ministry? Who is our neighbor and how will we best serve them?" I would gather congregations in each conference to share their most effective practices and ideas with each other, expand lay ministry, develop innovative use of staff and resources, and form partnerships to support each other's ministry. Crucial to our combined ministry is to continuously sink our roots deeper into the presence and love of God through worship, community-building and prayer.

Throughout the official business of the assembly we saw Macedonia videos submitted by member churches. It was energizing to see what other churches are doing. Worship was beautifully planned and the singing was phenomenal. There was a lovely banquet the first evening to say good-bye and God-speed to Bishop Hofstad. A budget of \$970,000 was passed.

We will look forward to meeting Bishop Jaeck on September 29 at our Building Dedication!
