PRAYER TOUR - SAT. OCT. 26 AT 1PM PUMPKIN FESTIVAL - SUNDAY OCT. 27 AT 3:30PM



Unless the Lord builds the house, builders build in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city; watchman stands guard in vain. In vain, you rise early and stay up late, toiling for food to eat- and he grants sleep to those he loves." Psalm 127:1-2

What does God want from his church and his people? Does Jesus Christ prefer sheer activity or pure passivity? Are we to be more like Martha (in the kitchen) or Mary (in the sanctuary)? Does the life of faith mean build a Tower of Babel or be like "the lilies of the field that neither toil nor spin"? The correct answer is yes, of course. God doesn't call us to choose between labor and rest, effort and faith, today and tomorrow. Psalm 127 posts a warning about work, "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders build in vain" later the psalmist names this promise of grace, "the Lord grants sleep to his beloved". These two godly signs give us boundaries.

These are signs we should heed at this point in our building project. Dedication Sunday was a remarkable day; worship extravaganza with brass and bishop, full house with old friends and new faces, Father Tim's robust blessing in the rain, and a tasty lunch around new tables and chairs. We have much to celebrate, so many people to thank, and more possibilities for ministry than we can yet imagine. God has blessed us richly with resources, leadership, and a ground-swell of support for this daunting project.

Vinland is by nature heavy on the Marthas and light on the Marys. We are more at home in the kitchen than the sanctuary. This is who we are. This has served us well, helped us to serve; from landscaping to painting, sending cards to serving meals, fund-raising to raising the roof. Is it time to pause to pray?

That is a crucial element in our upcoming enrichment gatherings. As an integral part of our building fund campaign, we are inviting every member of Vinland to come together to listen to each other, look at possibilities, and yes, yes, follow the financials. Being the bunch of doers, we will want to get right to business + bottom lines. As pastor, this is a time we hear the warning, "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders (Vinland) build in vain". Surely, God has given us much and guided on the way. But, what is the Lord calling us to next? Let's listen together.

LOFT FOR MIDDLE AND HIGH-SCHOOLERS LOFT is the name of our youth program. It stands for LivingOurFaithTogether!


**SUNDAY SCHOOL** happends in THE LOFT at 9:40am every Sunday. This is a combined class of middle and high-school youth.

## barb's backyard





Peering out, I see a vast landscape below - wrinkled, rumpled, and worn - spreading out in all directions as far as I can see. Appearing as a patchwork quilt, some of it has been cultivated; circles, squares, and rectangles clearly indicate patterns of tilling, planting, and irrigating.

Some of it is wild and untouched - or nearly so - hills and mountains with rugged edges descending into steep canyons or wide valleys. Throughout the cultivated land, and less so through the wild, run narrow, winding roads, appearing much like pencil lines drawn at random. We know that they really are not random, but only appear that way from the air. They each serve a function - most of them, at least - to lead you and me and others from here to there. As I study these myriad, meandering pathways, the thought occurs to me that we really often have no idea where we're going.

We usually know where we begin our journey and where we are want it to end, but no way can we see the entire route. From my vantage point high above, I can easily see the long-range route of each path - the straight, level sections, rolling hilly parts, steep winding curves, and sometimes the dead ends. All of this may be apparent to those who travel those ways frequently, but for others the finding is in the traveling. And even if someone were to view their chosen route from high above, carefully plotting their course, the reality of traveling there might be entirely different. For there are always the unknowns - detours, alternate routes, unforeseen obstacles, unplanned changes, sudden disruptions, and other things we never imagine. And so it is not always a simple matter to get from here to there.

Is this not much the way our lives are - simply trying to get from here and now to there and then? We all know it is never that easy, for our chosen paths are not always straight, smooth, and even. Some of us know exactly where we want to go, carefully choosing a direct route that should get us there with a minimum of time and trouble. Others of us have no idea where we want to go, daily muddling through and taking whichever turn in the road looks like it might lead somewhere, anywhere at all. Those who plan carefully may be in for surprise route-changes on the way. Those who wander may stumble onto a route that takes them to a place they never thought they'd be. Most of us probably think it's better to plan ahead, but there really are no guarantees. Much of our road in life is simply unknown.

So what are we to do? There is an African Proverb that says "*If you don't know where you're coming from, you don't know where you're going.*" It is best to figure out where we are now before plotting a course for the future. Weighing our options is always a good idea, as is getting some advice from others who might have taken the same route. It can be a lonely journey, so we mustn't forget to ask for directions and help when we need it. Together, we can step boldly forward in faith, but we must have some idea of where we want to go. For, as Lewis Carroll wrote: "*If you don't know where you are going, any road will get you there.*"
