"When Jesus saw the crowds, he had compassion on them....Jesus said to his disciples, 'The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest to, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." *Matthew* 9:36-38

It was some years ago at a synod assembly, when as a body we were voting on resolutions. Some of these resolutions stir controversy (such as sexuality issues) and others are automatic (affirm church efforts to combat world hunger). One year we actually debated whether our synod should be a Great Commission synod. The Great Commission is Jesus' command to all his followers, "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit." How would the Vinland vote go on the Great Commission resolution? The thing is we don't get to vote on being a Great Commission church. It all comes with Christ.

At last month's council meeting, I shared an article "Retail Evangelist" from a pastor who, between assignments, worked at Macy's for a year selling shoes. He writes, "Every pastor should work at Macy's. You will learn to how to punch a clock, meet a sales goal, deal with irritating customers, and work alongside people who have no choice but to come in the next day and do it all over again. I had to prove that I could sell shoes. Retail evangelism is not unlike church

outreach. Make contact. Ask open-ended questions. Inspire the sale. Celebrate the sale. "So much truth! The best training ground I ever had for outreach was working three jobs- minimum wage- in Billings, Montana post-college. I met all sorts of people where they are, how they are, and for what they are. It was amazing to me how open co-workers were with their spiritual questions and answers. That was a long time ago. Now being an ordained pastor for twenty years, I don't get such ready access to evangelism. When folks find out you are a pastor, they run, hide, or rant.

The workers for the harvest that Jesus refers to in Matthew's Gospel, are you and I. As we complete our new building, many have expressed our need to reach out to widen the Vinland circle. The harvest in Poulsbo has great potential and workers are not that few. Plus, God has given us more space for God's grace. At this time in our congregation's life, we have vast opportunity before us to expand the circle. To witness, work of evangelism is something we all share. Lord, give us the grace to invite neighbors, friends, co-workers, family to encounter the risen Christ here!

A committed group gathers on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays at church to put together quilts for Lutheran World Relief. No experience necessary...just come!


