One of our Vinland highlights leading up to Christmas has been the youth service.

Karyn Crawford, our gifted youth director, not only coached and orchestrated our youth, but also shaped a meaningful Christmas message for us. The sermon/skit was of a simple Christmas photo that morphed into a mall atmosphere with all the holiday junk that distracts us from the birth of Jesus Christ. When Devin Horn came out with the old rugged cross, planted that in place of the cute, inflatable Frosty the Snowman, and declared, "This is NOT Christmas!", I wanted to stand up, clap, and cheer.

The slide show of worship and service added a very joyful exlamation point.

Luke is the master storyteller who begins with the big, bad Roman Bureaucrat who issues a decree, drinks another glass of wine, eats a cluster of grapes - and Mary and Joseph pack provisions and head out on the Roman road toward the city of David. These two young people are just faceless nobodies under the boot of an uncaring empire. And yet, the Christmas gospel shifts the focus from Rome and rulers to Bethlehem and a newborn baby. *This IS CHRISTMAS because this IS THE KING OF HEAVEN AND EARTH!* As the people of God in this time and place, may we shift our hope away from the mall, consumption and military might and direct our hearts to the Christ-child, Emmanuel, the cross through worship and service.


