"Into your hands, O merciful Savior, we commend your servant \_\_\_\_\_\_. Acknowledge, we humbly beseech you, a sheep of your own fold, a lamb of your own flock, a sinner of your own redeeming. Receive her/him into the arms of your mercy, into the

blessed rest of everlasting peace, and into the glorious company of saints in light. Amen. (Commendation from the Burial of the Dead Service)

Death is hard. We never know how losing someone we love is going to impact us. This past week we had two deaths in our congregation. One was the great, old saint Mabel Raab, 99, who had been active and generous at Vinland for many decades. The other was a new friend of the church, Jerry Widrin. Sadly, Jerry was only 51 when he died of pancreatic cancer. Vinland hosted a fine funeral for Mabel with a nice lunch. There was laughter, tears, memories, food, friends, and thanksgiving. At the graveside it started to snow. In our cemetery, resurrection was in the air.

Having visited Mabel for the past ten years and having presided at Jerry's July 2011 wedding, I know I will miss them both. Looking out on the Vinland cemetery, snow is covering all the graves of the saints. Winter is here big-time. Scripture compares death to sleep. At the resurrection of the dead, the promise is that all those who have fallen asleep in Christ will be awakened. All the Lord's sheep and sinners will at last be received into the arms of God's mercy. We live between our mortality and redemption. We make it from here to eternity by grace.

The gateway to the Season of Lent is Ash Wednesday. At this somber and earthy service, we put ashes on our forehead in the sign of the cross. We recall that we are dust and to dust we shall return. We spend time in confession and are absolved in Jesus' name. We receive the Lord's Supper and are sent out to begin this 40 day-journey with a stark reminder of our core identity as Christ's. The Apostle Paul puts it this way, "If we live, we live to the Lord. If we die, we die to the Lord, so then whether we live or whether we die we are the Lord's." We need to hear this often. We need to receive the sign of the cross in ashes. It all points us back to our baptismal identity.

# barb's backyard



The squirrels are in trouble at our house, big time - \$2,400 worth! And they have paid a heavy price...

In all honesty, I think we asked for it. Well, some of it at least. We are animal lovers and over the years have enjoyed feeding and observing wild birds. Anyone who does this knows that squirrels come with the bargain, whether desired or not.

They simply show up one day, and, like the birds, pass the word on somehow to their fellow squirrels. There is quibbling, to be sure, but somehow they work it out so that most of them get at least a portion of what they come for. And, as with us human cousins, what they get soon leads to what they want - MORE of everything!

So here we have the wonderful little native Douglas Squirrels or Chickarees. For some time, we've enjoyed their antics and haven't really minded the sunflower seeds they go through, except during those times when they feel compelled to bury them <u>everywhere</u>. We have learned not to leave fabric tablecloths or chair pillows out for long as they tend to become nest lining. Mostly, their damage has been minimal and we've learned to live with it.

A couple of years ago, however, we did observe one squirrel in particular running back & forth between our carport and the woods with a mouthful of what looked like chewed-up yarn. Careful observation and inspection led to the car, but we could not see any obvious damage. That squirrel was run over on the road soon after and we forgot all about it. Then, last summer I noticed a small pile of insulation on the back seat of the car. Still, no sign of damage elsewhere - until the fan began to make strange noises when running. We took the car in and damage was found - extensive damage. The repairman told us that "some rodent" had chewed into the fan box, wiring, and much of the insulation lining the hood. To reach, and replace, all of the damage required taking out the entire dashboard. Parts and labor added up to a tidy sum. And so, war was declared on the dear little creatures. They have been unceremoniously removed, gently and otherwise, until only a few remain. Doubtless, their numbers will again increase in time.

Sadly, we don't even know for **certain** that they caused the damage - mice and rats have been known to do the same thing. We merely deemed them "guilty by association" and declared them guilty. This is something unbelievably easy to do and we all do it from time to time, sometimes with animals, more likely with our fellow humans. It is completely understandable that when we feel wronged or damaged we want to strike back. Sometimes this is justified - more often it is not.

The Season of Lent Begins February 22



Our heartfelt sympathy goes to Barb and Bill Erickson. Barb's sister passed away following a brief illness.


### **SHARE THE GOOD NEWS!**

Thank you to everyone who purchased sack lunches on annual meeting day! Your support is much appreciated! All the food was donated by preschool families and board members, so a portion of the money raised will go into the Nancy Pearson Scholarship Fund and the rest will go toward other needs of the preschool.

Preschool board members have been considering the potential enrollment for the next school year. There is a high possibility that we will need to add another class for 3-5 year olds in the afternoon. Both of our classes are currently at full enrollment and we have a waiting list of two people wanting to enter the 2-3 year old class this year. Registration for next year will begin toward the end of March for currently enrolled students and congregation members; registration will open to the general community in April.
