# Out Back in the Garden

After a nearly unprecedented 8 weeks without a drop of rain, the weather has finally turned sodden again in our corner of the world. Well into October, while trying to finish up gardening chores at home, I found the ground in most areas dry as far down as I dug. It was the same back in the Discovery Garden.

Many garden plants and vegetables, such as those in the flower beds and raised beds, suffered during this drought and needed to be watered. The native species, however, have done just fine. They have, after all, lived here for eons and are well-adapted to the soggy winters/summer droughts of the Pacific Northwest. This is exactly why they are so highly recommended for our personal, as well as the church's, landscaping. In fact, native species are **required** landscaping for our planned new building. This is a good thing, as the majority of the native seedling trees and shrubs that we planted out back a couple of years ago seem to be thriving!

Some of the deciduous trees that were bone dry have given up early, simply dropping their leaves without a lasting show of autumn color. The huge conifers are drooping and many of the cedars are "flagging" prolifically. It is perfectly normal for them to do this on occasion, but these stately giants of the tree world require rich, damp soil to thrive and hot, dry weather may stress them enough that some of their needles turn a rich orangish-brown and drop. I'm sure they are now heaving a collective sigh of relief - the return of the rain will undoubtedly perk them all up again.

## The Seasons are Changing....

The crisp days of fall are upon us and with them come the fall holidays...Halloween and Thanksgiving and then Christmas won't be far behind. The church also operates on seasons and the very first season of the church year is Advent.

The word Advent comes from two Latin words, "ad" and "venire", meaning "to come." Advent begins the fourth Sunday before Christmas and ends on Christmas Eve. This year Advent begins on November 28. To Christians everywhere, Advent is the season for waiting and watching for Christ. During the dark month of December we think of what Jesus' coming meant to the people who waited for Him to be born and what it means to us today.

Each year an advent wreath is hung in the front of the sanctuary. It is covered

with everygreens and adorned with 3 blue candles and 1 pink candle. Each Sunday, we light one additional candle on the Advent wreath, adding more light to our world the closer we come to Christmas Day, the day when Jesus, "the Light of the World," took away darkness and fear forever. The first candle we light is canlled the candle of Hope. This candle reminds us that God made a promise to His people. He gave them hope by promising to send a Messiah. The second blue candle is the candle of Love. Its glow is meant to warm and fill u s with the love of Christ, now and forever. The third candle we light is the pink one, the candle of Joy. Jesus' birth has brought joy to the hearts of millions of people since his birth 2,000 years ago. The last candle is the candle of Peace. Just as the angels who appeared to the shepherds brought them news of peace on earth, so we pull away from the busy pace of the season to focus on the peace Christ brought to the
