Session Highlights

Regular meeting, April 12, 2016

- **Finance:** Session approved \$1,500 to Mission to increase Presbytery Partnership Giving from \$6,000 to \$7,500 and approved an additional \$1,750 for Youth Ministries for Triennium conference funds.
- Christian Nurture for Youth: Session approved a pancake breakfast on May 1, a standard annual fundraiser for Youth Missions.

• **Building:** Session approved the following security changes: 1) Post building hours on front and east doors, 2) Repair doors that don't lock securely and service locking mechanisms, 3) Use existing security alarm system when appropriate, 4) Unlock only the east door during business hours and unlock front door only for Preschool drop off and pickup, 5) Utilize the current auto-lock/keycard system for after-hours use of building.

Finance Report

Congregational giving remained strong for the first quarter of 2016. Contributions to our general mission were slightly ahead of plan, and giving to *the Building in Christ* campaign remained robust, totaling \$47,390 January through March. Thank you for continuing your financial support for the mission and programs of Valley. *Frank Powers, Treasurer*
