Lent is a journey that can help us bring our spiritual life into sharper focus.

The only thing is that we don't let ourselves see it."

Each of the agencies receives approximately 1/3 of the offering to help communities adversely affected by crises and catastrophic events, to alleviate hunger and the systemic causes of poverty, and to respond to communities affected by racism, oppression, poverty and injustice.




