## **Vital Congregations Survey Summary**

The VC survey was composed of two parts: a multiple choice section from PC(USA) and a free response section from the Valley committee. A summary is below and the complete, detailed report follows.

#### Multiple choice survey:

- 178 responses (56% of Valley's membership)
- Valley's vitality score of 70 is 7 points below the average of other congregations who
  have taken this survey to date (We don't yet know the total number of congregations
  participating, but will share that information when we receive it from Presbytery.)
- PC(USA) suggests we pay particular attention to areas where responses from the congregation and responses from staff/leadership vary by greater than 10 percent. For Valley, two areas fell into this category:
  - Caring relationships (81% of the congregation felt this area is strong; 64% of staff and leadership felt this area is strong)
  - Empowering servant leadership (76% of the congregation felt this area is strong;
     63% of staff and leadership felt this area is strong)
- Highest overall score: caring relationships
- Lowest overall score: intentional authentic evangelism

#### Free response questions:

- 120 submissions representing 479 unique comments
- 57% of those comments pertained to what Valley is doing well
- 39% of those comments were suggestions for areas that need improvement
- 4% were general comments not related to either category
- The top three positive responses pertained to:
  - Valley's sense of community
  - o the care of our members
  - our pastor
- The three areas that had the most suggestions for improvement were:
  - Growing our membership
  - Providing variety in worship music
  - programming





### INTERPRETING YOUR RESULTS

Remember, this report is not a judgment of your congregation or its ministries. Rather, it is an assessment of its current state based on the perceptions of your worshipers and leaders.

The cover page of this report provides you with some key overall data. First, take note of how many respondents you had. What percentage of your membership and leadership took the survey? Next, identify your congregation's overall vitality score. How does it compare to the score of other congregations that have taken the survey so far? Are you pleased with this score? Surprised? Now turn your attention to how your worshipers responded to the survey question "This church is spiritually vital and alive." Do most of them consider this statement to be true? Do worshipers and leaders answer the same? Finally, identify your primary strength and weakness as reported on the bottom of the first page. Do they surprise you? Why or why not?




