### LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLE (The Teed Family)

Watch and wait for Christ's coming! We light candles of hope, peace, joy, and love, remembering the promises of God with prayer. Hear these words from the prophet Isaiah: The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; Like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord GOD will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

We light this candle in hope. We light this candle in peace. We light this candle in joy.

Let us pray... Most Holy God, on this day we wait for the coming of the Christ Child with joy. May we be reminded of the words of your prophets of old, as we also listen for prophets of your word today. We yearn for their visions of justice, peace, and salvation to be realized for all who thirst for your presence today.

All: Let us walk in the light of the Lord. Amen.
