PRELUDE AND ELEMENTS

WORDS OF PRAISE (Isaiah 61:10-11)

I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole being shall exult in my God;

For God has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels.

For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.
