# "...let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us, looking to Jesus the pioneer and perfecter of our faith..." - Hebrews 12:1-2

During the last ten days, I have had the good fortune to attend several sessions of the World Athletics Championships in Eugene. This was the first time this global track and field championship was held on American soil... and it did not disappoint! We witnessed some amazing individual and team performances.

Last night, we watched the men's 4x400 meter relay final. The American men led the race from start to finish and won easily. This win was made possible, in part, by the flawless hand-off of the baton from one runner to the next.

I have been thinking a lot lately about how the exercise of pastoral leadership is very similar to a relay race. Each member of the team runs

After nearly 80 years as a congregation, Valley Church has had many "pastoral runners" on its relay team. Roughly 25 pastors have run the race with perseverance seeking to lead our congregation in the way of Christ. Some were with us for a long time, such as our founding pastor, Dr. Herbert Armitage, and some were here for just a few months. All of these individuals were part of a team effort and sought to contribute to the spiritual health and vitality of Valley Church. Each of these "pastoral runners" eventually passed the baton to the next person who would engage in yet another leg of the race.

I feel privileged to be running my leg of the race as your Interim Pastor during this important time. As I run my leg, I never lose sight of the fact that I am but one person in a long line of skilled and dedicated pastors who have helped to shape Valley into the church it is today. None of us as pastoral leaders could run this race alone! At the end of my time at Valley, I hope I will be remembered as a good member of the team, and that I passed the baton well to the person who will, by God's grace, continue the race after me.

## **Recycle Non-Curbside Plastics**



James Recycling, a local business founded by a young man on the autism spectrum, will be holding a pop-up mini event hosted by Valley. The event is Tuesday, August 2 and runs from 10:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. at the Youth House garage.

They will ONLY be collecting the following non-curbside items:

- #1 PET with no color such as berry clamshells and salad containers
- #2 HDPE such as Pak-Tek 6 pack holders and small white supplement bottles
- #4 LDPE such as snap-on lids
- #5 PP such as take-out containers, lids, and cups
- #6 PS rigid plastics such as clear take-out containers and to-go plastic coffee cup lids
- Make sure these items are numbered #1, #2, #4, #5, or #6.
- All items must be clean and separated by number NO commingled plastics.
- Household plastics only: nothing larger than a basketball.

No Styrofoam please. Drop off price is \$4 per standard grocery bag. For more information about items that will be accepted and sorting requirements, please visit www.jamesrecycling.com/events.
