

At our next meeting after worship at 11:30 a.m. on Sunday March 19, Together Women Rise at Valley will learn about and support Too Young to Wed in Kenya. This amazing nonprofit has a mission to empower girls and end child marriage globally. They carry out their mission by increasing school attendance and literacy, delaying marriage, informing girls and families of their rights, and

providing support and access to education, financial inclusion, safe spaces, mentors, and leadership opportunities.

Here is are two facts that are frightening:


1. Globally, every two seconds one girl is married against her will.

2. An additional 10 million girls are at risk of child marriage in the next decade as a direct result of the coronavirus pandemic, as deepening poverty drives more families to marry off their daughters.

Here is good news: Keeping girls in school is the single most protective factor against child marriage. On average, the likelihood of a girl marrying as a child is six percent less for every additional year she stays in secondary education. Too Young to Wed is doing just that.

Come learn more about how this featured grantee, an example of the nonprofits that Together Women Rise choose, helps promote gender equality because when women rise, we all rise. New members are always welcome and if you are already on the Book Group email list, you will receive a reminder of the meeting.




St. Matthew Lutheran Pantry

• Expand the congregation's vision and capacity to cultivate authentic and supportive relationships with next generation and community partners.


• Call a new pastor who has the capacity and demonstrated ability to lead adaptive change.

Mission Endowment Applications Due April 1

April first is the spring application deadline for grants from Valley's Mission Endowment Fund. The Mission Endowment Committee will meet in April to consider these applications and make recommendations to Session for grants to be awarded.

Created in 1979 by a generous gift from a member, the Mission Endowment Fund is an important part of Valley's mission program. What organizations do you know of that further the work of Christ in the world? Think about submitting an application on behalf of one of them. Consideration is given to applications which:

- address hunger, food and health needs of people around the world
- assist volunteers in the mission field
- advance denominational programs of outreach, service and proclamation
- assist secular and social organizations that aid in the care of people.

In the past ten years, this fund has awarded grants totaling about \$200,000 to deserving applicants. No applications will be accepted after the April 1 deadline. Earth Care Corner

Food Waste

Are you interested in an extra \$1,500? That's the average amount that a family of four spends each year on food that they don't eat. According to a recent New York Times article, the average American household wastes almost a third of the food they buy. The UN estimates that worldwide food waste would feed one billion (yes, with a B) people. This is a huge opportunity! In the US, food waste is responsible for twice as many greenhouse gas emissions as commercial aviation. I had no idea how large this problem was.

The Mayo Clinic recommends these seven actions to reduce food waste in your own family:

- 1) Take inventory before shopping
- 2) Create a meal plan
- 3) Eat or freeze leftovers
- 4) Store food appropriately
- 5) Buy "ugly"
- 6) Compost
- 7) Use leftovers creatively.

I can see a lot of opportunity for improvement in my own habits here and will attempt to mend some of my ways now that I'm more aware of the scope of this issue.

Community programs have also been effective. For example, by implementing a powerful public awareness campaign, one region in Central Ohio was able to divert an extra 19% of waste from landfills via recycling and composting. Local regulations have been helpful in ensuring that unused food from grocery stores and restaurants is donated rather than tossed.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance

Thousands have died in the February 6 earthquake in Turkey and Syria, and survivors face freezing weather with no shelter. Presbyterian Disaster Assistance is responding through partner organizations in the region. Contributions should be designated DR99999 ST Earthquake. You can also give online through the Presbyterian website or by placing your check made out to Valley (VCPC) with "Disaster Relief" in the memo line. For those funds collected here, Valley's Mission team will add matching funds up to \$1,000 to be forwarded to PC(USA). Please keep their citizens and aid-workers in our prayers.
