A SENSE OF URGENCY

he New Year is often depicted as a tiny baby. There is much comfort in this concept. A new beginning, new opportunities, and time. But there is also a danger that's as old as mankind and that is believing that somehow we have all the time in the world.

This problem existed in Christ's day. He had to warn: "Don't you have a saying, 'It's still four months until harvest'? I tell you, open your eyes and look at the fields! They are ripe for harvest." Jesus also reminded the disciples that people with a 'the Lord delays His coming' attitude would ultimately fail in the stewardship of life.

The year is new. Three hundred sixty-five days lie ahead, eight thousand seven hundred and sixty hours are ours to use as we please. But what we need is a sense of urgency. We must work to be faithful stewards of the time given us. Stewardship is taking care of everything God gives us and if we consider that everything given us, including the precious gift of time, comes from God Himself, then things start to take on a whole new perspective.

The very foundation of Paul's ministry was driven by a sense of urgency. He knew there was no time to lose. In 2 Corinthians 6:2, Paul says "NOW is the accepted time."

There are those who proclaim that the world as we know it will come to an end in December of this year. No one truly knows. When will the Lord return? We have a lot of help in scripture that points us to the times and His return, but no man knows the hour or the day, except God Himself. It could be this year. A sense of urgency will cause people to attempt the seemingly impossible. It was a sense of urgency that made Abraham attack an alliance of kings with only 318 servants and Abraham dealt the enemies a devastating blow. It was a sense of urgency that made Esther a heroine in saving her people. She declared, "If I perish, I perish!" A sense of urgency is demanding. It requires dedication, sacrifice, and effort. But the sense of urgency is also rewarding. The history of the church is not only the story of men who served, bled, and died, it is the story of men who found their lives.

"For whoever wants to save their life, will lose it. But whoever loses their life for me, will find it!" Matthew 16:25.

Our time is NOW! I am filled with anticipation at the possibilities of at least 10 new church plants this year in our state, and the eventual completion of our goal of 100 new churches in 10 years. We were able to plant eleven churches in 2011 for which we give thanks to God.

I am grateful for the opportunity to serve the state Arizona. I pray for your encouragement and strength in the Lord as we work together in the harvest. Paul says in Colossian 4:5 "make the most of every opportunity." Let's make the most of any and every opportunity TOGETHER!

LEO GODZICH IS IN HEAVEN -



sympathy is ur extended to the immediate family of Dr. Leo Godzich, along with the Phoenix First Assembly church family, in their loss of a staff member and dear friend who spoke healing into the lives of so many.

Dr. Leo Marc Godzich was involved in a fatal automobile accident while on a mission trip in Uganda, Africa, on October 27, 2011. He was born April 30, 1959, in Soissons, France, and is survived by his wife of 29 years, Molly, and

his daughters, Emily, Bethany, and Christy. Pastor Leo Godzich served as an associate pastor at Phoenix First Assembly of God for over two decades under Pastor Tommy Barnett. He received his Doctorate from Phoenix Theological Seminary. He, along with Molly, founded the National Association of Marriage Enhancement (N.A.M.E.), a ministry to promote marriage and train and certify lay marriage counselors. There are over 200 NAME centers across the globe on six continents. He was also the founder of the International Marriage Conference, an annual event that has drawn tens of thousands over the past 16 years.

He is the author of numerous books and training materials, including Is God in Your Marriage?, Men are from Dirt and Women are from Men, and Faith of our Founding Fathers.

In civic affairs, he helped author and pass Covenant Marriage legislation in Arizona and Louisiana and was a founder of the Covenant Marriage Movement as well as serving as a member of the Arlington Group. He will perhaps be best remembered for the impact he had on individual marriages through personal counseling, the hundreds of marriage conferences he held, and his speaking engagements at conferences around the world.

Molly and Leo worked together and played together. They enjoyed traveling together, playing games with their children, and their special "date" nights.

Emily, 20, has been studying theology at Southeastern University (AG) in Lakeland, Florida. She and Matthew Nilsen plan to marry next year. Emily works part-time for her parents at the NAME marriage headquarters.

Bethany is 17, and Christy will be 15 in December. Both girls attend Paradise Valley Christian College Prepatory in Phoenix. Leo was very involved in the girls' schooling and education and was well-known by the other parents on campus because of his involvement in their productions and sport activities. He often gave the benediction at special events. The girls are extremely involved with their church, Phoenix First Assembly, participating in district Fine Arts competitions, Phoenix First Assembly's Christmas productions, and their discipleship group called Ignite.

Our prayers are continuing for those left to live their lives without the godly guidance and influence of Dr. Godzich. He will be greatly missed.

THE POWER OF ENCOURAGEMENT

n his classic book, "One Minute Manager" Kenneth Blanchard recommends developing the practice of "One Minute Praises" where the manager (pastor, parent, spouse, etc.) tries to **"catch someone doing something right"** and then spend a full 60 seconds praising that person for the good deed. This is a lot more difficult than it appears. Where we might not find it difficult to criticize someone for even 60 minutes, many times we find it almost impossible to praise someone sincerely for a full minute.

That's too bad, because a basic element of living the Christian life that we see defined so clearly in the New Testament is the practice of encouraging others. Paul said, **"he who prophecies speaks to men for their strengthening, encouragement and comfort."** (1 Corinthians 14:3)

This is what preachers should do; our sermons should strengthen, encourage and comfort the listeners. This is also what church members should do; our conversations with each other should be a source of strength, encouragement and comfort.

John Maxwell writes in his book "Developing the Leaders Around You" that UCLA basketball coach John Wooden told players who scored to give a smile, wink, or nod to the player who gave them a good pass. **"What if he's not looking?"** asked a team member. Wooden replied, **"I guarantee he'll look."** Everyone values encouragement and looks for it.

It's good to be specific in your praise. Take time to look up the times the Apostle Paul specifically praised people for what they had done, even naming names. It seems he is always specific in his praise for each church; "...I thank God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout the world." (Romans 1:8)

Paul ends the book of Colossians with some personal notes. Look at what he says about some of his fellow ministers: **"…Tychicus will tell you all the news about me; he is a beloved brother, a faithful minister, and a fellow servant…he is coming with Onesimus, the faithful and beloved brother...Epaphras is always wrestling in his prayers on your behalf…"** (Colossians 4:7-17)

When the Apostle Paul talks about the end time, where I believe we are now living, he says **"Therefore encourage each other with these words."** (1Thessalonians 4:18) What words are we to use? That Jesus is returning in the clouds of glory to take his people to their heavenly home. The world constantly tries to discourage us, so it is vitally important that we believers in Christ be encouragers.

In all your "resolution making" for the New Year, why not make a resolution to be an "Encourager". Encourage your fellow pastors and the people you minister to each week. Encourage the waitress at the café you frequent and encourage your neighbors and friends.

Take time to write an email to the missionaries you support and just let them know you appreciate the work they are doing to advance the Kingdom and let them know you are praying for them.

It was important for the Apostle Paul to be an encourager, let's follow his example.


