"Please excuse me. I do not intend to be a nuisance, but, in light of the information I have received that is headed, "Basis of Representation Woman's Auxiliary." I am afraid I am, once, again, confused. According to this information. Districts represent with \$150. Is this a separate \$150.00 for the District Women's Auxiliary? District Presidents, according to this information, represent with \$35.00. So, then, to represent my district woman's auxiliary, do I need to pay a total of \$185.00, in addition to registering as a general member with

I received the following email from one of the constituents of the convention because we had communicated earlier about representation during the convention. The basis of her second communication with me is the result of the inconsistency in our message about registration. Here is an excerpt from the content of her mes-

\$50.00?"

This is the very reason why I asked to provide some written information for the constituency. I understand the confusion. We have too many voices saying different things about the same subject. It is the Tower of Babel all over again. We will not ever be able to move forward together as a convention until we get on the same sheet of music and sing the same song. We don't necessarily have to be singing in the same key, even though that would help, but we do need to be singing the same words at the same time.

The answer to the question is that the basis of representation is the same for everyone. Districts are to represent with \$300 providing for two delegates. Churches represent with \$150 providing for six delegates. Individuals not representing a church or district association represent with \$50. Additional delegates beyond the limits set for districts and churches are assessed at \$10 per delegate. The ancillary fees for officers, pastors, ministers, committee members, etc. are not covered in the basic representation. This fee schedule applies across the convention, no matter what auxiliary you attend or with which you register.

Specifically, here is the amount to be paid: As a district officer, the person should pay \$335 (\$300 for district + \$35 for the district officer). If the district is not representing, then the person should pay \$85 (\$50 for individual + \$35 for the district officer).

This is a real situation that is indicative of a problem that has persisted because some have yet to conform to the convention's standard. We need both clarity and consistency. Right now, I'm trying to bring a little bit of both by sharing this information. There is still more to the story.

The Women's Auxiliary invites the constituency to join them in their Annual Fashion Share Luncheon on Tuesday, November 11, 2014 in the Family Life Center of St. James (parent body). Tickets, \$15, are still available. This event will begin @ 12 noon.
