

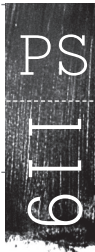
THIS WEEK IN THE BIBLE

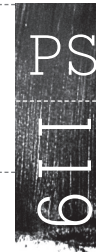

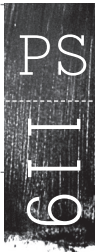

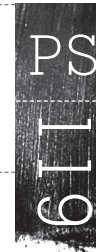
