Meeting Time: Royal Rangers meet in the Beige Wing on Wednesdays at 7:00 pm.

Ages: Ranger Kids is for Kindergarteners – 2nd graders and Discovery Rangers is for 3rd grade – 6th grade.

Royal Rangers is about hands-on adventure and side-by-side relationship building. It's how boys learn and relate best. Beyond the fun, boys discover they have what it takes to be men as they spend time with mentors outdoors, in the classroom or in the gym.

The Royal Rangers Emblem is a stylized compass rose containing points in three different colors: Red, Blue, and Gold. The four red points represent "the four main teachings of the church": salvation, baptism of the Holy Spirit, healing, and rapture. The four gold points denote the four ways a person grows: mentally, physically, spiritually, and socially. Finally, the eight blue points represent the virtues that make up the Ranger Code: alert, clean, honest, courageous, loyal, courteous, obedient, and spiritual.
