



Needed to-date to support budget \$530,048

Difference (short of expenses) -\$ 10,061

Difference (short of budget) -\$ 50,116

At the end of June we were \$32,343 short of covering actual expenses and \$56,367 short of supporting the annual budget to date. From the figures above we can see progress is being made. Though some end-of-the-month bills have yet to be paid, at the same time there remains one more Sunday offering to be received.

Trustee News

At the August Trustee meeting, the Trustees heard about Sidewalk House facility progress. Volunteers installed a wall and door in the open back of the carport, the basement refurbishing is almost complete and Interfaith Works staff will coordinate the development of an herb garden in the back yard.

Trustees obtained estimates for repairs to the bell tower, which has been leaking into the Gathering Place for years. Repairs are estimated at about \$30,000. Removal of the bell tower was estimated at about \$75,000. The Church Council will be asked for guidance on this issue.

They are contacting electricians about installing an electrical panel for Camp Quixote.

How to Schedule Activities at FUMCO

In the distant past anyone could schedule an activity and reserve a room in the church by simply writing on a calendar hanging on the office wall. However, that practice ended more than 10 years ago! The current procedure is to use a request form called the Blue Slip. When you or your group wishes to reserve a room and/or hold a church related event. activity, class, meeting, what-haveyou, you must fill out a Blue Slip. Your request is then processed, checking to see if the space is available; how it fits in or may impact other activities already scheduled; and if the activity is in alignment with FUMCO's mission and ministry. It may take a few days for a request to be processed, after which the office staff will contact the requestor of the status.

So, plan ahead. Before you make any announcements about your activity, be certain you have received approval through the Blue Slip process. If there is any change in plans, such as cancelation or relocation, let the office know.

Above is the procedure for FUMCO activities. Outside groups must go through a different application process, which involves proof of being a non-profit organization and provision of insurance and possibly other agreements. If you belong to an outside organization, being a member of FUMCO does not give your organization special privileges when it comes to securing the use of church facilities. The reason for this has to do with liability, tax and non-profit regulations, and fairness. Everyone's participation and understanding is appreciated.

Facebook Tip and Thoughts: Who are you talking to?

When you make a status update to your facebook there is a small icon to the left of your post button.



When you post to your facebook you have options of who is going to see what you write. They are:

- **Public**: Everyone (including your boss, pastor, mom, and google can see what you post.)
- **Friends**: Just the people who you have agreed to be your facebook friend will see your post
- **Friends**+: If you tag someone in a post, your friends and their friends can see what you post.
- Only Me: This is meant for only you to see on your facebook page.
- Custom: If you select this menu item, you can limit those who view this post to specific lists of people or even specifically exclude (your boss, pastor, or child) individuals from seeing what you post. While this selection may take a little bit more time to set up, it gives you complete control over who is allowed to see your posts.

By checking this menu, you are able to control those people are hearing you through the social networking medium and maintain your privacy while connecting with those you cherish in this social media.

Got Emergency?

There is about a 33% chance that a disaster will occur when you are in the dark and in bed. Be prepared day or night with an under-the-bed stash of critical items. Minimum supplies would be a pair of sturdy shoes for every resident, work gloves (preferably leather,) a hard hat, and a flashlight Additionally, a checklist or written guidelines to help you recall / locate such items as medicines, food and drink locations, key phone numbers, reading glasses, spare keys, etc. It would be a good idea to place these items in a large sealed plastic bag or bin as, after the disaster event, there may be broken glass in the area.

One of my charges here at Olympia is to work on developing a "Young Adult New Faith Community." This is an exciting ministry and a hopeful commitment on the part of FUMCO.

I believe that every generation has an important contribution to the Body of Christ and the life of our church. As a young adult I also am aware of the many barriers that my generation and the ones after me face when committing to Christianity and a Christian community. I am looking forward to working with FUMCO as we invite young adults to be a part of a Christian community and learn what our contribution to the ongoing Christian faith shall be.

Currently, I am receiving training from the New Faith Development office from our Annual Conference to hone my skills in outreach, networking, and community building. Since FUMCO has made the commitment to this New Faith Community, the Annual Conference is responding by providing the funds for my training.

If we imagine ministries of a church being part of continuum of dependence upon a church, there are many different levels of dependence and independence.

A Bible Study would be almost completely dependent upon a church that it is located in. A "parachute church start" on the other hand would be entirely independent of any other church community. This new faith community will be somewhere in between these two poles, with some aspects being dependent upon FUMCO and other aspects being independent.

This year will be a year of learning these skills, meeting new people, and listening to God's direction for what possibilities this endeavor will bring to our church. Each young adult Christian community looks different and ours will be a unique response to the context and needs of our community and church. It will evolve and grow as we respond to God's call through our community's needs.

October 7, 2012 is World Communion Sunday, when we celebrate our connection with the world-wide Christian church. On that day, we will be receiving a special \$6 offering. In the United Methodist Church there are special offerings that are received to fund special ministries both locally and around the world. One such special offering we receive every Spring - the "One Great Hour of Sharing" offering that funds the United Methodist Committee on Relief. There are six other special offerings that we put together on World Communion Sunday. We ask everyone to donate at least \$1 for each offering - a total of \$6. These are the ministries they go to:

- Human Relations Offering supports vital community ministries that teach and advocate for justice, especially among people struggling to survive in the margins of society. Specifically, grants are given for the Community Developers Program, the United Methodist Voluntary Services Program, and the Youth Offender Rehabilitation Program.
- 2. Native American Ministries both within our Annual Conference (Pacific Northwest) and nationally provides scholarships for Native Americans attending schools of theology. It also supports the Native American Urban Initiative.

- Peace with Justice ministries is split between our Annual Conference and the global United Methodist Church to promote and support peace with justice ministries and initiatives.
- 4. World Communion Scholarships provide undergraduate and graduate scholarships for ethnic minority persons, as well as support inservice training programs. A good portion of the scholarships are given to students beyond the United States.
- United Methodist Scholarships and U.M. Student Loan Fund help UM families and individuals pay for their education.
- Global AIDS Fund is working toward an AIDS-free world, by stopping the transmission of HIV from mother to child, teaching young adults about HIV prevention, and feeding an HIV-positive person, among other prevention and research.

By giving \$6 to these special ministries, you join United Methodists all over the world to make visible God's reign on earth. Thank you for your generosity.
