Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I am Ben Beard, the new Council President. First I want to thank last year's Executive Committee for their service - Kim Campbell - President, Chris Watt – V.P., Robbie Giles – Secretary, and Gwen Mitchell and Jon Kimberling – CoTreasurers, for all their hard work in leading Emmanuel's ministries. When you see these servants, please be sure to stop and thank them for their service.

The new Executive Committee members are myself, Martha Hunt – V.P., Liz Brandt – Secretary, and Gwen and Jon – CoTreasurers. I am excited to serve with such thoughtful and faithful people. We have already seen the amazing people God has given our congregation handle a major water leak at the end of March. On March 27 the City made the first actual reading of our water meter and realized we have been high. The next day there was a shutdown and an excavator came in and a section of our water main was replaced outside the pre-school rooms. Thanks to K & K Excavating, McCoy Plumbing, CindyMarie Polley, Craig Greenwalt, Vern Kinnison, Kevin Peterson, all our Preschool Staff and families who dealt with school being cancelled while the repairs were being done, the Staff who DID come to work to assist the contractors and dealt with spending the day without water or heat, our cleaning service for cleaning up the muddy mess when the job was complete, Gretchen Isakson for providing cookies for the contractors and Anne Peterson, Jon Kimberling and Gwen Mitchell who dealt with all the paperwork involved. Anne Peterson has shepherded through City channels, our request for some forgiveness of the large water and sewer bill that resulted. All in all this leak has resulted in almost \$3400 in repair bills for the water main leading into the church, and almost \$4700 for our latest water and sewer bill from the City. As noted, we are working to obtain some amount of forgiveness from the City on that bill. In the end God was indeed watching over this congregation, as the damage (and expense) could have been much worse.

By the time you read this your Council will have met for its annual retreat. We will have discussed the Mission and Ministries God has laid before us, and considered how best we can fulfill God's will for our Congregation. We will have considered what you, the people of Emmanuel, consider to be our most important missions and ministries, and we will have discussed the options and resources available to God's people Emmanuel to fulfill those ministries. We will also have **set a date for a Congregational Meeting – likely in May** – when we can share with you our thoughts going forward. So PLEASE PLAN TO MARK YOUR CALENDARS TO ATTEND THAT CONGREGATIONAL MEETING WHEN THE NOTICE COMES OUT.



Our congregation is blessed to have such abundant talents and treasures in our midst. We saw those talents come forward in dealing with the water leak emergency. We are blessed by the prayerful giving of our members. I would like to close this May Letter with two requests. First, as you see above we had an extraordinary expense hit the Church with this water leak. I ask that you prayerfully consider whether you might be able to add a little to your regular offering. Second, please consider joining the Church's automatic giving plan. Summer is upon us and many of us will be enjoying travel and time out of town. The Church's expenses do not stop, but often it is easy to miss a pledge when you are not in church. With automatic withdrawals through Simply Giving, your pledge is kept current and the Church can continue our ministries uninterrupted.

Welcome to Easter! Rejoice in the grace and redemption of Easter, and all that means for each of us.

Letter from the EDITOR

Isn't Easter fantastic!
It just seems to bring so much... **NEW! New** growth, **new** attitude, **new** opportunities, **new** ways to look at things...

I am hoping to incorporate all the above "new" in my service to you here at Emmanuel.

While researching ways I can do more for you through my work for the congregation,

I learned of how the "church secretary" position has evolved with the new ways people interact with each other.

The church secretary's new title is "Church Communicator."

Jenn Eickman of Concordia Technology Solutions defines the role of a Church Communicator like this:

"Defining the church communicator role is easier said than done. There doesn't appear to be a standard definition for what a church communicator should be. The people who coordinate communications at churches come with many different skill sets and gifts, offering a diverse range of contributions to ministry.

All church communicators are facilitators, project managers, organizers, and leaders with creative souls, but that creativity can take many different forms. Some of us are writers, marketers, problem solvers, or big-picture type of folk. Some are graphic artists. Some photographers or videographers. Others are website builders and coders. The honest truth is that we are each uniquely distinct.

Despite the diversity, we all have one common element at our core—we love Jesus Christ. Therefore, church communicators look for ways to assist and guide the congregations where we work to help communicate the Good News within the church community and the outside world."

Jenn goes on in another article to list three big reasons why churches need a trained Church Communicator. I wish to discuss one of those today:

• Reason #1: To Manage Your Church's Other Front Door (a.k.a. our church website and social media).

Back in the day, it was important to have the church building open and staffed during typical business hours to meet new folks who were interested in learning more about our ministry. Demographics have changed. Business hours are no longer "typical." Even with our Emmanuel Family Members, I have found there is more people stopping by the church or calling with questions during the week in the early morning from 6:30 - 8:30 AM, or during their lunch time between 11 AM - 1 PM, then any other time during the day. It also is evident that the majority of people don't call and talk on their phones... they text or email.

Here at ELC we have some fantastic, tech-savvy volunteers. **Chie Baker**, serves as our website coordinator and TV slide show creator. **Kas** and **Deb Dumroese**, **Lisa Allen**, and a half-dozen others routinely post Emmanuel happenings and events on our Facebook page (which I give huge thanks to because that is where I find all the fantastic pictures to add to the monthly newsletter and weekly announcements!). With these great volunteers doing such a fantastic job I haven't had to invest the time to learn how to manage our digital thumbprint here at Emmanuel. Since this is a main doorway to new members, I plan to make it a priority to change that. The **ELCW** gave me the great gift of a year subscription to online continuing education this year. This online program has many courses available that address the areas of study I will need to become expert in and develop those new skills.

Personally, I'm still pretty "old-school" in my communication preferences. I'd rather call and talk to someone than email or text them. I know there are quite a few here at Emmanuel who share the same feelings. For that reason, I want to make sure everyone who calls the church knows that if you need to speak with me, my personal cell phone number is listed on our voicemail message when you call the church office. Feel free to call or text me at that number anytime! I also receive church email at home and check and respond to email requests as I see them. I'm here to serve!





Pastor Gordon Braun served as Senior Pastor of Emmanuel Lutheran Church from 1981 - 1995.
In 1988 he put together a "Worship Guide" for the members of Emmanuel which explains
many aspects of how Lutherans worship. Here is a segment of this Worship Guide. In our April issue, we
continued with an explanation of our Worship service. We move forward with a few more aspects of this.
This is shared in hopes that it may enhance your worship life.

In the <u>creed</u> we affirm our faith. We respond to the meeting with God in His Word (the reading and preaching) by saying "I believe." Either the Nicene or Apostles' Creed will be used. Occasionally the Athanasian Creed will be used. These three ecumenical creeds are accepted by all Christians. They are like a loyalty statement affirming our united faith with God and with each other.

The <u>prayer of the church</u> includes our common concerns. Specific and personal concerns are included when you request them. You are encouraged to do so whether it be sharing your joy or expressing your sorrow. We share the peace of God as an expression of our peace in Christ (John 14:27)

Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. - *John 14:27*

An <u>offering</u> is received in the service because it is an act of worship. We bring a portion of our blessings as an acknowledgement that what we have is a gift from God. Gifts are given in a spirit of thankfulness, faith and trust. The offertory is sung to express these concepts and then a prayer is offered reflecting our sense of stewardship.

The <u>Great Thanksgiving</u> begins the liturgy leading up to receiving communion. We greet each other in mutual prayer "The Lord be with you / And also with you!" You are invited to "lift up your heart." In other words, look up to God. Take your mind off yourself and be thankful. If there is thankfulness in your heart there is no room for bitterness. A proper preface for the season is sung or said and then we are ready for the elements of bread and wine to be consecrated with the words Jesus used when He instituted the sacrament (Matthew 26:26-29).

²⁶While they were eating, Jesus took a loaf of bread, and after blessing it he broke it, gave it to the disciples, and said, "Take, eat; this is my body." ²⁷Then he took a cup, and after giving thanks he gave it to them, saying, "Drink from it, all of you; ²⁸for this is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins. ²⁹I tell you, I will never again drink of this fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new with you in my Father's kingdom." - *Matthew* 26:26-29

We pray the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:9-13) and then are ready to receive the Holy Eucharist.

⁹"Pray then in this way:
Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name.

¹⁰Your kingdom come.
Your will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.

¹¹Give us this day our daily bread.

¹²And forgive us our debts,
as we also have forgiven our debtors.

¹³And do not bring us to the time of trial,
but rescue us from the evil one. - Matthew 6:9-13

"The body of Christ given for you. The blood of Christ shed for you." The words "for you" make it personal.

It is also a corporate matter for there is union in communion, union with each other as we kneel together at the rail. While you are waiting before and when you return to your pew make use of this time for meditation. You may use your Bible or Evangelical Lutheran Worship Hymnal (ELW) as an aid in your quiet time.

- 5. When dry, display your tree — or give it as a Mother's Day gift.









Pastor's Discretionary Fund

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund is used by the Pastor to assist individuals and families that are in need. Most often it is used to assist people who stop by the church office and request assistance for basic needs. Community organizations may also refer to Pastor, persons who need assistance. Pastor investigates each case by checking in with the Sheriff's Office and or Latah County Social Services both of which share a common data base that can spot repeating requests and persons to keep an eye on. These requests to the Pastor's Discretionary fund may be:





- They are homeless and need a place to stay for a night or two. The fund can provide temporary hotel housing for up to 3 nights while other arrangements are being made. Pastor will assist these people in connecting with local resources. Most people may receive housing assistance up to 2 times per year, however circumstances and situations may direct more assistance... especially when there are children involved.
- They may need assistance with utilities that are about to be denied. Pastor calls the utility provider and helps to set up a payment plan that incudes an initial payment from the Discretionary Fund.





- They are traveling through town and need gasoline or vehicle repairs so they can continue to their destination. Their personal resources are depleted. Pastor assists them in purchasing fuel or finding a mechanic who can repair their vehicle for a reasonable rate.
- People need to see a doctor or need medicine. Pastor uses the Moscow Clinic to provide these services. They may need a prescription filled and this is done through Rosauers Pharmacy.





- People may need food. They are connected with our local food bank and/or food is given from our ELC kitchen surplus or is purchased by Pastor.

Dear Parent(s) or Guardian(s),

Welcome to Lutherhaven Day Camp/ Vacation Bible School (VBS) sponsored by Lutherhaven Ministries and Emmanuel Lutheran Church, June 12-16, 2017. Our theme for this week is "Masterpiece!" based on Ephesians 2:10, "We are God's



masterpiece. He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, so we can do the good things He planned for us long ago." We are looking forward to a great week filled with Bible encounters, games, arts and crafts, singing and worship. To help things go smoothly here are a few reminders:

• We will be starting the day at 9:00 a.m. and ending the sessions at either 11:30 a.m. for the younger group (4 year olds to those entering kindergarten) or 3:00 p.m. for the older group (those entering 1st grade through 5th grade) in the sanctuary (upper level) at Emmanuel Lutheran Church (1036 West A St., Moscow, ID).

Monday-Wear an outfit that says something about you!

Tuesday-Crazy hair day! The crazier, the better!

Wednesday-Inside out, backwards, mismatched clothes day!

Thursday-Wear one color day!

Friday—Aloha/water day (1-5th grades should bring a swim suit and beach towel—for the afternoon,—wear sunscreen too!)

- Check-in begins at 8:30am daily! All youth will need to be checked in and/or registered, and signed out at pick up time at the end of the day in the narthex area (entry area of the church on the upper level). This is very important so we may ensure the safety of all the participants. Parents are responsible for filling out a name tag for each child using the template provided (the bordered name tag keys us that the child has an allergy or intolerance; this difference should be inconspicuous to the children at large).
- You are invited to stay as long as you would like and are encouraged to join us for Opening Worship at 9:00 a.m. each morning and Closing Worship at around 2:30 p.m. if you are able.
- A mid-morning snack* will be provided for all ages. The snack menu/schedule is:

Monday-Gorp! (raisins, popcom, gluten free marshmallows, M&M's)

Tuesday-Apple Slices & Veggie Straws! (apple slices, gluten free veggie straws)

Wednesday-String Cheese & Tortilla Chips! (string cheese and gluten free tortilla chips)

Thursday—Bananas & Cereal/Chex Mix! (bananas and gluten free cereal mix)

Friday—Cookie Power! (Chocolate covered marshmallow cookies, and other assorted sandwich cookies)

*IMPORTANT: If your child has food allergies or intolerances and you have any doubt regarding the snack items that we provide (described above), please send a separate 'baqqied' snack for your child for that day, clearly labelled with your child's name as well as the grade they are entering. You must give the snack bag to a camp adult leader at registration. Do not include this snack in their lunch bag; their lunch bags are stowed elsewhere until lunch time.

- If your child is in the older group (those entering 1st through 5th grade), please provide them with a sack lunch—LABELLED with your child's name. If your child(ren)'s lunch needs to stay cool, please use a cold pack or some other means to keep their lunch cool. We will have plenty of water coolers around in which the children may freely get drinks throughout the day (disposable paper drinking cups).
- We will also be spending a lot of time outdoors so please make sure they dress appropriately, wear shoes that they can be active in (like for running), and use sun block or some other sun protection.
- We will be having a family BBQ / potluck on Thursday evening from 6:00 p.m. − 7:30 p.m. We hope you and your family (and friends) will be able to join us. We will provide hot dogs, buns and beverages. Please bring a side dish or dessert to share. We will be sharing songs that we have learned during the week and maybe a skit or two. 




