# From Pastor's Desk... Both Sides of the Tapestry

Dear People of God,

There is an old story that explains well the days that follow from Palm Sunday to Easter. You have to hear and see both ends of Holy Week. I have shared this story with you in sermons...and I no longer can quote you its original source.

"The boy sat inside the Sunday School room, fascinated by a tapestry that hung the full length of the window. From its top edge, which touched the ceiling, to its bottom edge, which almost touched the floor, it was an utter mess. Random strands of thread stuck out all over the place. Knots were grouped together in chaotic bunches. If there was any design at all, it couldn't be detected. The artist who wove this mess together was clearly unskilled.

One Sunday morning, however, as the boy walked

into church with his parents, he saw that tapestry from outside the window. Now he was seeing the front side of the tapestry! What he saw was absolutely beautiful. The needlework was precise, the fabric dense with vibrant colors and images. The boy had never seen such an intricate design. The artist who wove this image together was obviously a master at his craft."

Our life is often like that tapestry. From our inside perspective, it looks like a mess, but from God's outside perspective, it is a beautiful, intricate design. God knows about messy situations. He sent his Son to the bloody, awful mess of the cross. On Good Friday, this was all Jesus' followers could see (Luke 23:48-49). But even that was part of God's plan, part of his design for the world: to forgive you of all your sin and bring you close



to him once again. And three days later, we began to see the other side of the tapestry. What a beautiful, intricate design Easter is indeed.



We continue our study of The Gospel of John - "Book of Glory," in our Sunday Adult Class on April 6, with the Execution of Jesus (John 19:16b-42)

Dr. Craig Koester, in

Symbolism in the Fourth

Gospel, writes: "One of the
most basic questions in
Christian theology is: Why did
Jesus die?" Later he provides
the answer: "Put very simply,
John understands that Jesus
died to reveal God's love to
the world."

Lutheran theology is a "theology of the cross" which means that in the cross of

Jesus Christ God most deeply expresses infinite love for humankind and the creation. Another Christian writer - not Lutheran - writes: "The theology of the cross is first of all a statement about God . . . God thinks humankind and the whole creation so good, so beautiful, so precious in its intention and its potentiality, that its actualization, its fulfillment, its redemption is worth dying for." (Douglas John Hall, The Cross in Our Context)

JSBach, in his "Passion According to St. John," has the choir sing yet another chorale, this one as the crucifixion comes nearer:

"Through your imprisonment, Son of God/freedom has come to us; Your dungeon is the throne of grace/the refuge of all the devout; For had you not entered into servitude, Our servitude would had had to be everlasting."





It is an opportunity for youth to engage in worship and fellowship with peers from across the United States and the world who share a common commitment and faith in Christ. The next Youth Gathering will be held July 15-19, 2015, in Detroit, Mich.

Many ELCA congregations see their participation in the ministry of the ELCA Youth Gathering as one aspect of their work to fulfill the promise they made around the baptismal font to raise



faithful young people who:

- Live among God's faithful people,
- Hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- Proclaim the good news of God in Christ through their words and actions,

What happens during the ELCA Youth Gathering?

The Youth Gathering is a five-day event that begins on a Wednesday evening and ends with a service of communion the following Sunday morning. With help from a fundraiser at our church, the generosity of fellow church members, and Latah County Thrivent for Lutherans, I was able to purchase a factory modified van which should serve me many years. This wonderful surprise contributes toward my independence in so many ways, allowing me to live a "normal" life on my own. Your encouragement continues to mean so much to me as I now fight to eliminate an addiction to pain medications. I thank the Lord each day for having given me such compassionate friends within the Lutheran faith.

At the time of my accident I was on an errand for the first annual Emmanuel Lutheran Preschool Spaghetti Feed, a program close to my heart. I encourage all to buy a ticket or donate to this year's feed and attend. All of the proceeds go directly to scholarships for children of needy families at our preschool.—Larry Clott

Really, it's okay if you volunteer to do something.

We saw about a 20% jump in the number of simply givers. Great! Two-thirds of the folks who pledged are now also simply givers.

Great! We meet our budget

on a month-by-month basis. Those that use simply giving help our treasurer know what to expect each month, and having a more consistent level of giving, especially during the summer, helps us meet our ministry and mission work during those traditionally "leaner" months. And, those pledge cards... what about them? Well, they help all of us take time to reflect on our many blessings and how we will respond to God's extravagance. The conscious effort of filling it out makes us mindful, improves our discipline. And, if we do this consistently, it would aid Church Council and the Finance Committee in formulating annual budgets. If you haven't turned in your forms, please do so. We can't be whole without

you.

Remembering, we are "Riding the Wave" during Lent. We are taking this time to ponder our baptism. "Ride the Wave" is our theme for the next few weeks, thanks to the Stewardship Task Force. It's another step in our 18month stewardship journey. During Lent we'll be focusing on what it means to be baptized. We've already heard about it from the pulpit, during Lenten worship, and even during J.A.M. (expect more). We'll be riding that wave until late April / early May when it culminates with a special focus on the precious water of the Palouse, led by Jon Kimberling and Pastor Dean Stewart. Part of understanding our baptism is realization of God's extravagance to us. Baptism



and its promise is just one of the ways God rains down blessings on us. Blessings of time, talents, and treasures.

And the Construction/
Building/Bathroom
Committee is about ready
to start renovating the
downstairs bathrooms.
They plan to start with the
men's side and complete
the women's side after
Preschool and VBS adjourn
for the summer and plant to
be done before the fall
schedule starts. They'll be
looking for volunteers. Be
ready. Be willing.

# February Financial Report from the Treasurer

Income and expenses this year need to average about \$26,200 per month to meet budget. Income for the general fund in February was about \$23,900, and expenses paid during the month were about \$24,600. As a result, the general fund

deficit for the yearto-date increased by \$700 to about \$6,500. Expenses for the year-to-date are slightly below budget. With 16.7% of the year behind us (two months) we have spent 16.3% of the annual budget.


