




## Rally Day on September 7<sup>th</sup>? What's That?




## **Prayer Pieces - All Are Welcome!**

## **ELCA Youth Gathering** July 15-19, 2015 Detroit, Michigan

The ELCA Youth Gathering for high school-age youth takes place every three years and is about faith formation, worship, study, fellowship, service and play.

It is an opportunity for youth to engage in worship and fellowship with peers from across the United States and the world who share a common commitment and faith in Christ. The next Youth Gathering will be held July 15-19, 2015, in Detroit, Mich.

Many ELCA congregations see their participation in the ministry of the ELCA Youth Gathering as one aspect of their work to fulfill the promise they made around the baptismal font to raise faithful young people who:

- Live among God's faithful people,
- Hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
- Proclaim the good news of God in Christ through their words and actions,
- Serve and love our neighbors, following the example of Jesus, and
- Pursue justice and peace in the world.

What happens during the ELCA Youth Gathering?

The Youth Gathering is a five-day event that begins on a Wednesday evening and ends with a service of communion the following Sunday morning. The opening night sets the stage for the days ahead in which young people may have an encounter with Jesus that energizes their faith and helps them further discover their call to live and serve in the world locally and globally.

On the days between Wednesday and Sunday, young people rotate through a variety of service learning experiences in the surrounding community. They explore and strengthen their faith by studying God's word, serving their neighbor, sharing bread and wine in worship, participating in lively faith discussions and broadening their experience of God's world and diverse communities through travel. For many young people, traveling to the ELCA Youth Gathering is the first time they have been out of their county or state.

When the question "Why work so hard to gather so many young people in one place?" pops up, the response is really quite simple.

We were meant to be together, and we are a church that believes God is calling us into the world together.

So every now and then, we gather young people and adults together to share their unique stories and to experience the larger story that makes up the ELCA; we gather to be inspired, encouraged, strengthened, connected and sent out to do God's work in the world — together!

#### What you do:

- 1. Using the cardboard insert or picture from the frame as a pattern, cut the notebook paper to fit the frame. Then insert it behind the glass.
- 2. Decorate the outside of the frame by gluing on buttons, ribbon, stickers or foam shapes.
- 3. Glue one side of the Velcro to the erasable pen and one side to the frame. Then attach the pen to the frame.



## **Pastor's Discretionary Fund**

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund is used by the Pastor to assist individuals and families that are in need. Most often it is used to assist people who stop by the church office and request assistance for basic needs. Community organizations may also refer to Pastor, persons who need assistance. Pastor investigates each case by checking in with the Sheriff's Office and or Latah County Social Services both of which share a common data base that can spot repeating requests and persons to keep an eye on. These requests to the Pastor's Discretionary fund may be:

+They are homeless and need a place to stay for a night or two. The fund can provide temporary hotel housing for up to 3 nights

while other arrangements are being made. Pastor will assist these people in connecting with local resources. Most people may receive housing assistance up to 2 times per year, however circumstances and situations may direct more assistance...especially when there are children involved.

- +They may need assistance with utilities that are about to be denied. Pastor calls the utility provider and helps to set up a payment plan that incudes an initial payment from the Discretionary Fund.
- +They are traveling through town and need gasoline or vehicle repairs so they can continue to their destination. Their personal resources are depleted. Pastor assists them in

purchasing fuel or finding a mechanic who can repair their vehicle for a reasonable rate.

- +People need to see a doctor or need medicine. Pastor uses the Moscow Clinic to provide these services. They may need a prescription filled and this is done through Rosauers Pharmacy.
- +People may need food. They are connected with our local food bank and/or food is given from our ELC kitchen surplus or is purchased by Pastor.
- +Preschool families sometimes need assistance with, rent, utilities, food, medicine, clothing or tuition.



ELC has the gracious ministry of "loaves and fishes," assisting people with their most basic needs. This is a very "hands on" ministry through our Pastor. The Pastor's Discretionary Fund is in need of your financial support. Could your support for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund be above and beyond your usual gracious giving? If you are able to, please give a separate offering ear marked for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

(Our Church Treasurer and our Pastor administrate the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.)

## Treasurer's Report

#### FINANCIAL REPORT—JULY

Income and expenses this year need to average about \$26,200 per month to meet budget. Income for the general fund in July totaled about \$22,300, and expenses paid during the month were about \$23,200. As a result, the general fund deficit for the year-to-date and is now about \$7,400.

Expenses for the year-to-date are somewhat below budget. With 58% of the year behind us (seven months), we have spent about 55% of the annual budget.

#### WHAT WE OWE:

In early August we received an additional \$500 contribution to help pay down our debt with Wells



Fargo Bank. The balance owed on our line of credit is now about \$13,900. Interest charged for the past month at 5.75% was about \$67.

## **Family Promise** of the Palouse

Family Promise brings faith communities together to help families who are temporarily distressed due to various reasons such as job loss, unexpected health costs, domestic violence, or a car accident that eliminates transportation or access to a job. FPP supports homeless families with children who are facing short-term problems that would probably lead to longer-term poverty and more family dysfunction.

Family Promise of the Palouse has a network of 28 interfaith congregations that provide overnight shelter, meals and hospitality to families in need. This network is made up of approximately 700 volunteers. Congregations take turns hosting up to four families for one week at a time before they move on to the next congregation. During the day, families have access to a shower, laundry facilities, the internet and case management at our Day Center.


