



"PRAY WITHOUT CEASING" I Thess 5:16


We need to give a great big round of applause to our Church Council. They are a remarkable group with wonderful ministry gifts that have given and given and given of their time, talents, and treasure.

The church in Giekau is named after the apostle and evangelist Johannes (John). It is one of the churches founded by Graf Adolf IV of Schaumburg after his victory over the Danes at Bornhöved in 1227. Construction is believed to have been completed by 1240, and the church was first mentioned in a register in 1259. The old tower was replaced in 1811-12 with the current one, which is 105 feet tall. It houses 2 bells, a large one cast in 1616 in the Northern Sea port town of Husum. The smaller bell is a replacement for an older one and was cast in 1974. There is also an hour bell, which was made from a bomb shell dropped nearby the church at the end of WWII. The wooden gothic altar is dating back to the year 1500. The baptismal stand dates from 1781.

The main reason, why we chose this church and its congregation (serving a population of about 3,000 in 18 surrounding villages) is that it is the congregation of Mark's mother and her ancestors. Mark's grandma was baptized and married in this church and she is resting in the graveyard right behind the church, as are his great-grandparents. His mom was baptized and married in this church, as was his sister. So in many regards that has been for generations the 'family' church. Pastor Günther Suckow was excited about the idea of the baptism, and it took place on Sunday, August 31, 2014.








## a passion for COMPASSION

#### PALOUSEPROFILE

avid Daugs loves to tease. When his next-door neighbor's Ford Explorer was having some alignment issues, he couldn't resist telling a mutual friend, "Britta's having some rear end problems." They also have an ongoing debate about whether it's better to be German or Swedish. That's just the kind of guy he is.

But around Moscow, he's known for more than jokes and a little backand-forth fun with his friends. He's been a pastor for 29 years, and as the senior pastor at Emmanuel Lutheran Church, he makes a difference in peoples' lives every single day.

In addition to his duties at church services, David's vocation takes him to people's homes, charities, hospitals, and wherever else he might be needed. "I hear their stories, how they connect to the community, their interests and avocations," David says.

The power of witnessing in people's lives guides David's practice. He listens, and then invites people back into a community of faith.

#### Drawn to the community

As it turns out, David and his wife, Kris, already think Moscow has a great sense of community. They arrived two years ago after David expressed interest in an opportunity to pastor here. After a number of years serving in more rural areas, he was excited about the chance to be in an environment that had so much support for education, including higher academic standards and two nearby colleges, and the added culture that those institutions bring to a town. His wife, a math teacher for 20 years, also looked forward to working in a place with so much community participation.


The couple has three children of their own, all grown – two live in Phoenix, one lives in Pasco. David's pastoring role is a full-time job, and Kris teaches 7th and 8th grade math at Moscow middle school. "She spends her day with all those 13-year-olds, and then comes home and has to deal with me," he says with a smile.

#### The power of compassion

Around his neighborhood, David is known for mowing neighbors' lawns, letting people borrow his tools, and caretaking the community property whenever it needs attention. "I believe we can all make a difference right where we are," he says. And he practices what he preaches.

What makes his livelihood and calling most meaningful are the moments when he can truly be present for those going through major life-passage events.

"Just this week we had a stillbirth, two new babies, and an elderly man who is waiting for a lung transplant and may not get it," he reflects, compassion evident in his voice. "To go from that depth of grief to that joy, and finding patience and understanding, is what this is all about."



While many of David's practices might seem natural for a pastor, he also believes that every person has the power to make the world a better place, just by how they respond to others.

"I encourage people to practice gentleness, kindness, and patience, whoever they are," David says. "And anybody can do that. Many people who aren't Christians do it very well. And if we all do that, imagine what a wonderful community we'd have."





The Mission Endowment committee encourages everyone to attend and vote in person, but absentee ballots are available up until the celebration. They are due in the church office by November 2<sup>nd</sup>. Check out these great programs:

- **#1 Moscow Ecumenical Outreach (Global).** Works to alleviate hunger globally through support for Heifer International and locally through support for the Moscow Food Bank. Amount applied for: \$2,000.
- **#2 Emmanuel Piecemakers (Global).** This money will be used to ship quilts and school kits to Lutheran World Relief. Amount applied for: \$600.
- **#3 Women of the L.C.A. (Global).** Will support the female students of our sister congregation in the Ulango Kilombero Synod in Tanzania. Amount applied for: \$1,000.
- **#4 Doctors Without Borders (Global).** Will support medical efforts in conflict zones worldwide, especially the immediate need of care for ebola patients in West Africa. Amount applied for: \$3,000.

#### **Emmanuel Lutheran Preschool News!**






Make this Thanksgiving decoration and keepsake as a reminder of God's many blessings.

- Acrylic paints
- Paint brush
- White cardstock (8" x 11")
- Baby wipes or wet paper towels
- 8" x 11" frame (available at dollar stores)
- Black permanent marker
- Bowls or paper plates

#### What you do:

- 1. Paint your palm, fingers, wrist and a portion of your arm with brown paint.

#### **Pastor's Discretionary Fund**

The Pastor's Discretionary Fund is used by the Pastor to assist individuals and families that are in need. Most often it is used to assist people who stop by the church office and request assistance for basic needs. Community organizations may also refer to Pastor, persons who need assistance. Pastor investigates each case by checking in with the Sheriff's Office and or Latah County Social Services both of which share a common data base that can spot repeating requests and persons to keep an eye on. These requests to the Pastor's Discretionary fund may be:

◆ They are homeless and need a place to stay for a night or two. The fund can provide temporary hotel housing for up to 3 nights while other arrangements are being made. Pastor will assist these people in connecting with local resources. Most people may receive housing assistance up to 2 times per

year, however circumstances and situations may direct more assistance...especially when there are children involved.

- ◆ They may need assistance with utilities that are about to be denied. Pastor calls the utility provider and helps to set up a payment plan that incudes an initial payment from the Discretionary Fund.
- ◆ They are traveling through town and need gasoline or vehicle repairs so they can continue to their destination. Their personal resources are depleted. Pastor assists them in purchasing fuel or finding a mechanic who can repair their vehicle for a reasonable rate.
- ◆ People need to see a doctor or need medicine. Pastor uses the Moscow Clinic to provide these services. They may need a prescription filled and this is done through Rosauers Pharmacy.
- ◆ People may need food. They are connected with our local food bank and/or food is given from our ELC kitchen surplus or is purchased by



Pastor.

◆ Preschool families sometimes need assistance with, rent, utilities, food, medicine, clothing or tuition.

ELC has the gracious ministry of "loaves and fishes," assisting people with their most basic needs. This is a very "hands on" ministry through our Pastor. The Pastor's Discretionary Fund is in need of your financial support. Could your support for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund be above and beyond your usual gracious giving? If you are able to, please give a separate offering ear marked for the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.

(Our Church Treasurer and our Pastor administrate the Pastor's Discretionary Fund.)



#### ARRIVAL

The five London-bound YAGMs landed in Heathrow at 8:35 a.m. on August 21st. We made it through customs and baggage claim (where I filed a report for my lost bag) and found Chrissie, a Time for God worker who guided us through our first train journey. By the time we arrived at the Guy Chester Centre I had no idea what time it was. Chrissie answered our dumb questions and advised us to stay awake as long as possible that

day. So, naturally I fell asleep at about 4:30 p.m., woke up briefly for dinner and snoozed until the next morning.

For the next six days, we explored the big (free) sights of central London. We spent a memorably wet day at the Notting Hill Carnival and a pleasant afternoon at a local palace-slash-park. We rode more double-decker buses than I can count, and we got lost quite often.



We sprung for a flight on the London Eye on oun of our last days and managed to catch it right at dusk. We saw all the lights come on while we were right near the top. Pretty stinking cool.

#### ST. SWITHUN'S

The train pulled into Winchester and I lugged my bags through one last gate into the waiting arms of Rev. Katrina Dykes. Unpacking and putting those suitcases away was wonderful. My room in High House had been stocked with magazines, travel guides,

and a lovely orchid (which is still thriving). The 40 High House girls arrived over the next few days, and then classes began.

I'm officially the Chaplain's Assistant and a Gap Assistant in High House. I spend most of the school day with Katrina and most mornings and evenings in High House. I help plan and carry out Christian Union, confirmation, boarders' chapel, a junior school assembly, and junior school Bible Club each week. Each Monday I'm in charge of waking up the house, Wednesday and Thursday evenings we have a tutor helping out, and I'm on duty every other weekend leading and chaperoning activities with boarders from all houses and ages.


