

Pentecost Power

Ten days after Jesus ascended into heaven, the Holy Spirit descended onto Jesus' disciples. While they were gathered in Jerusalem to celebrate the Jewish festival of Pentecost, the disciples saw flames among and on them, heard a rushing wind and began talking in many languages. As a result, the disciples were able to share the good news of Jesus in the native tongues of all the pilgrims assembled in the city.

Even today, the power of the Holy Spirit fuels the "flame" that ignites Christians' outreach efforts. Only by the Spirit's power can we know Christ and make him known throughout the world.

Poet William Blake (1757-1827), who's been described as a passionate, Pentecost kind of person, wrote this poem about the Spirit's power:

Unless the eye catch fire,
The God will not be seen.
Unless the ear catch fire,
The God will not be heard.
Unless the tongue catch fire,
The God will not be named.
Unless the heart catch fire,
The God will not be loved.
Unless the mind catch fire,
The God will not be known.





Verdell brings not only a warm smile to the food pantry not far from her home, but also her elderly mother, who was diagnosed with Alzheimer's 10 years ago.

Verdell, who lives with rheumatoid arthritis, had a good office job in downtown Chicago until her company outsourced the department. This made it possible for Verdell to care for her mother full time.

The food pantry she and her mother visit monthly is a big help. "We do eat better when we come here. It's harder and harder to get out with mother, but the people here always make us welcome," Verdell says. Two years ago several of us from Emmanuel and two friend from Moscow traveled to northern Tanzania and met poor and hungry people. The ELCA World Hunger Appeal supports efforts in Tanzania to overcome poverty and hunger. Florence Nkini went to a seminar where she learned about boiling her family's drinking water. Now she teaches others to do the same. She was one of four who attended a seminar on community health sponsored by the Lutheran Church of Tanzania and ELCA World Hunger Program. Another woman, Hawa, in central Tanzania, is a grape farmer. Through ELCA World Hunger and Lutheran World Relief she, along with 2000 grape farmers, has learned to increase grape production despite drought.

What Are All These Boxes About?

These crazy boxes are a mode of communication my friend! I consider myself a savvy, in the now, hip kinda gal... but I had to look up what a QR code and a URL actually was.

Here is what I found on Wikipedia, (the "Encyclopedia on the internet):

A <u>uniform resource locator</u> (abbreviated <u>URL</u>; also known as a <u>web address</u>, particularly when used with HTTP) is a specific character string that constitutes a reference to a resource.

Most web browsers display the URL of a web page above the page in an address bar.

A typical URL might look like:

http://www.wikipedia.org/wiki/Main_Page

QR code (abbreviated from Quick Response Code) is the trademark for a type of two-dimensional barcode (the crazy boxes). Originally designed for industrial uses, QR codes have become common in consumer advertising. Typically, a smartphone is used as a QR code scanner, displaying the code and converting it to some useful form (such as a standard URL for a website, thereby obviating the need for a user to type it into a web browser). The QR code has become a focus of advertising strategy, since it provides a way to access a brand's website more quickly than by manually entering a URL.
