DRINK FROM THE SPIRIT 'S RIVER OF LIVING WATER

Jesus knew how to get peoples' attention. He was present at the Feast of Tabernacles, a festival that commemorated the Israelites' entrance into the Promised Land after forty years of wilderness wanderings. It was a joyous celebration that came shortly after the Day of Atonement on which the High Priest offered sacrifices for the sins of the people.

"On the last and greatest day of the Feast, Jesus stood and said in a loud voice, "If anyone is thirsty let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, streams of living water will flow from within him" The Apostle John writes that, "By this he meant the Spirit, whom those who believed in him were later to receive." [John 7:37-39]

Living Water! Jeremiah, the great prophet of the 7th century before Jesus, was called by God to prophesy, or speak God's word of warning to the Israelites, "My people have committed two sins: They have forsaken me, the spring of living water, and have dug their own cisterns, broken cisterns that cannot hold water.' Jeremiah 2:13

The Holy Spirit's presence in our lives provides a stream of living water that wells up within us. He is like an artesian well within our spirits, springing up with the life-giving water that keeps us spiritually hydrated, and spiritually fit for whatever comes.

Just as our physical bodies require water to keep us from becoming dehydrated and experience physical problems as a result, so it is with our spirit.. We need water from the River of Life to sustain our spiritual health and wholeness.

If we experience dry spells in our daily Christian life, perhaps we are not taking time to rehydrate our spirits with the Holy Spirit. Is it possible that we have, as Jeremiah said, substituted other cisterns that can't hold water? Is it possible that we run all over the country, searching for other sources of spiritual refreshment; other speakers, other stuff and things, other broken and imperfect cisterns. Yes, we can gain some temporary thirst quenching experience, some ministry that lasts for awhile. But, what do you do when the "well runs dry?" Go listen to another speaker? Buy another object? Drink at broken cisterns that can't hold water?

The "Spring of Living Water" about which God spoke through Jeremiah, does not run dry. It cannot be reduced to a trickle. It is a **River** of Living Water.

Jesus declared it six hundred years after Jeremiah, "If anyone is thirsty, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, streams of living water will flow from within him."

We Christians must examine ourselves regarding these "dry spells" that we experience. Am I staying in the presence of the Holy Spirit? Am I enjoying worshiping him with all my heart, soul, mind and strength? I know that the Word of God instructs me to "not grow weary in well doing." Am I weary in well doing? Am I also weary from the various battles—spiritual and otherwise, through which I am going? Does my hunger for the things of God, wax and wane on a regular basis? Has my Spring become a cistern?

If any, all, or other questions like these surface in our lives, then, now is the time to heed the call of Jesus Christ: If we've tried other cisterns for spiritual renewal and find that they can't "hold water," then Jesus has the answer for which we are really searching:

"Come to me if you're weary and worn out. If you're thirsty, then come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, streams of Living Water will flow from within you." Jesus "O Lord, let it be so." lle

About five weeks ago I was invited to share with a small group in Birmingham, Alabama, about healing. After I shared, they asked me if I would be willing to come and teach them about healing. I took the "Anointed to Heal" book and began a journey with them. Over the last several weeks we have had as many as 20 and as low as 12 in the group.

We are meeting in one of the most prestigious country clubs of Birmingham. When we began the sessions, some of the workers in the country club asked if they could sit in on the meetings. We welcomed them.

This has been a very unique time for all that have attended. The first time, I went just to share on healing with the small group of twenty-five. REPORT FROM INDIA

We want to thank all of you for your prayers and financial support. We were so blessed this year as some people took an active role in raising funds for the Christmas program. This helped us to focus on the program and the realities at hand in India. We saw a great victory. Many young people took an active part in sharing the word of God and their testimony and all of our youth worked hard. Someone who stood out was Somesh, a 17-year-old who worked hard for two months leading practices and choreographing many of the dances. As usual it was a powerful time of community life. We (our groups youth) shared the gospel for the first time in the Paniyan language which is the mother tongue of the Paniyan people. We also faced some opposition and one broken glass was thrown into our group of 60 plus singers, dancers, and drummers. It hit the back of one of our young men and left a huge welt even though he had 3 layers of clothing. If it had hit a child or hit someone jagged edge up it could have been fatal. We praise God for divine protection!

Watch Night Service

31st watch night we had 60 new people from one colony and our people were so excited to see the glorious hand of God. They were so excited that they could not go to bed and celebrated the whole night.

Reuniting of a Family

January 1st, 2018 started out with a bang. One couple was reunited after being separated for many months. We went as a team returning the wife and 5 children back to the estranged husband's home. At the home we had a short prayer meeting and then had tea and snacks. It was our privilege and honor to council them and bless them. Now they are the active members of our fellowship. Glory to God.

While we were getting the wife and children organized another father from a family came up to Jeremy and asked, "Would it be all right if you came and led a prayer in our home." This of course was music to our ears. He is a strong successful tribal who had shown no sign of wanting Christianity but who was touched by the joy of his children and the power of the testimonies from the youth in his colony.

Building Work

Granite flooring was laid on the stage and around the baptismal tank as well as on all of the pillars and as cladding in the front of the building. It all looks beautiful and we thank the Hawaiian team for choosing the color and material and for sponsoring this work.

Electrical

Bright and wonderful LED lights in the stage, hall room, main room, upstairs and Sunday school rooms, library room, parking lot etc. It looks like daylight and is so easy as opposed to constantly connecting extension cords with bulb fittings. We have put in around 60 light fixtures and the building literally glows. Thanks for all your help.
