ISAIAH 53:3-5

"He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

Surely he has borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed."

I have felt empty.

You lost things in the last year, too. Maybe far more than I have lost. Many people have. We are human and when God's people suffer, God comforts us. Our suffering helps us to not only sympathize with another person's hurt, but because of God's compassion for us, we can show that same compassion to them.

2 Corinthians 1:3-4 (NIV)

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of compassion and the God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our troubles, so that we can comfort those in any trouble with the comfort we ourselves receive from God."

It is okay for us to grieve our losses. We aren't robots. God knows we hurt. Jesus lived here among us and felt our pain and loss and it made him the perfect intercessor for us. And he intercedes for us always – so says God's Word. But we must not allow grief to linger too long, because when we do it turns into something else – hopelessness. And hopelessness comes from feeling separated from God. Of all people on this earth, we who know Jesus are the ones who are never hopeless.

"CHURCH, I WILL BE WITH YOU ALWAYS." JESUS.

"On the evening of the first day of the week, when the disciples were together for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." [John 20:19]

Before Jesus came into their midst, his disciples were behind locked doors, afraid, living in fear for their lives. Then Jesus came into the room! His presence changed everything and everyone. Their Fear was replaced by his Peace.

Prior to Jesus' death and resurrection, he taught them about the kingdom of God and then demonstrated what he was talking about. "Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and preaching good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness among the people." [Matthew 4:23] These were teaching and training times for his disciples.

When he felt that they had learned and seen enough, he sent them out to teach and do what he had taught them. They had a specific job description and the way they were to accomplish "These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions. "As you go, preach this message: 'The kingdom of heaven is near.' Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, drive out demons. Freely you have received, freely give. Do not take along any gold or silver or copper in your belts, take no bag for the journey, or extra tunic, or sandals or a staff, for the worker is worth his keep." [Matthew 10:5, 7-10]

The disciples were sent out without any money or extra clothes. They were not to be focused on whether they had money, food, shelter, or clothing to sustain them. They were to be about being obedient to do what Jesus told them to do and trusting God for their care. Consequently, miracles happened, lives were changed, and they and the new believers thrived under the circumstances. Then, following Pentecost and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, nothing could stop them. Within a few years, every encounter became an opportunity to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ – either from a chariot on the way to Ethiopia or in a jail cell in Rome.

Fast forward to the 18th century AD. John Wesley had a call of God upon his life to preach the Gospel. Following a life-transforming experience at Aldersgate when his heart was "strangely warmed," he went forth in the power of the Holy Spirit and followed the job description that Jesus had given to his early disciples. One result of this "new enthusiasm" for the Gospel, the Anglican churches of England were all closed to Wesley. He had no pulpit, no support, no pension, and no guarantee of anything but work and hope. Yet, the Lord - through him, awakened a whole nation – not to mention the world, to the power of the Resurrected Christ. Somehow, God provided, and he lived a long life, bearing much fruit by making disciples and transforming his world. Do we not follow the same God who has the same power?

Fast forward again to now, 2021 AD. We have a choice: either remain locked up in fear of what religious, or any other authorities, or a Covid virus might do to us, OR we can regardless of whether we have properties, monies, ecclesiastical agreement or permission, and without fear, do what Jesus told us to do: "Go, make disciples, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey all that I have commanded you. <u>I will be with you always</u>, even to the end of the age." [Matthew 28:19,20]

When the Resurrected Christ promises that, how can we possibly stay locked up in fear or even wait until we have the financial resources to do it? The choice is before us! Obedience to the instructions of Jesus could very well cause us to see miracles happening once again in the contemporary church as they happened from the beginning!
