### **BETTER A NEW LIFE THAN A NEW YEAR**

It is the custom in virtually every society of humans to celebrate the beginning of the New Year. The celebrations usually include loud and noisy gatherings accompanied by fireworks, loud bands, riotous partying, drinking and hangovers the next day.

In the United States, the New Year is usually welcomed and the Old Year bid adieu with the singing of Auld Lang Syne, the meaning of which is from the Irish, "old long since" or "long ago."

There is much ado about making a list of New Year's Resolutions that we absolutely intend to keep in the days, weeks and months ahead. We sometimes go to great lengths in making the list and then making a resolve to keep the resolutions. Usually, however, by the end of the week—or perhaps by the end of January 1, the list has been lost. Oh well, perhaps next year we'll resolve to do better.

There is a better way to celebrate newness in our lives than loudly welcoming in the New Year with loud parties and soon to be broken resolutions. The better way is that of getting a new life.

Jesus said, "I have come that they might have life and have it to the full." [John 10:10] That new life is found in him who is the giver of life. The Apostle John wrote in another place, "In him was the life and that life was the light of men." [John 1:4] And, "The true light that gives light to every man was coming into the world. He was in the world and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him." [John 1:9, 10]

The Apostle Paul declares in his Second Letter to the church in Corinth [5:16] "So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! All this is from God...."

Not only a new life, but a new creation altogether!

That new life in Christ is easily identifiable for it is in stark contrast to the life of one who lives in the world and is of the world. That person has adopted and reflects the ways of the world.

It is the Holy Spirit of God that brings us to new life. The fruit of that Spirit begins to remold and reshape the human life into the image of Jesus that God had for it in the first place. That Spirit Born life becomes evident as it bears the fruit of that Holy Spirit, which is "love [that is manifested in] joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. "[Galatians 5:22]

These character traits of the new life of a Christian soon become very evident. They stand in stark contrast to the sinful nature and lifestyles of the world: *"sexual immorality, impurity and debauchery, idolatry and witchcraft; hatred, discord, jealousy, fits of rage, selfish ambition, dissensions, factions, envy, drunkenness, orgies, and the like."* [Galatians 5:19-21]

A person may walk into a brand New Year while holding on to their old, unchanged life and it will make no difference how many resolutions are made, that old life remains the old life. And, the New Year remains pretty much like the old one was.

However, when a person resolves to allow God's Holy Spirit to give birth to a new life in Christ, everything is new. He or she is new! Their outlook on life is new! Their hope for the future is new! Their relationships take on new meaning! They develop a new circle of friends and discover a new joy in their life. As Paul reminded us: *"If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has gone, the new has come."* 

We give praise to God for a New Year in which we may experience life, hopefully in new ways. We have greater reason for giving praise to God if we walk into the New Year with a New Life in Christ that we can celebrate throughout the year.

My one resolution this year: Allow Jesus to help me live life to the full.

Wind of the Spirit Ministries is a 501 [c3] non profit, faith based ministry. All financial contributions to the ministry are tax deductible.

Many years ago the Board of Directors were led by the Holy Spirit to set aside a tithe [10%] of all contributions to the General Fund, to be used for mission outreach. As a result, the Lord has guided us to fund college and seminary education for young men and women in the Philippines, provide support help for the pastoral leadership of Wind of the Spirit Ministries in the Philippines, Rev. and Mrs. David Sablan, and also for our missionaries in India, Jeremy and Joy Ellington.

#### PHILIPPINE MEDICAL MISSION

The rains came, the streams rose up, the wind blew and beat against those houses and the typhoon force, 200 miles per hour wind of typhoon Yolanda destroyed much of Visayas, Philippines. The devastation caused by the winds and rain is unmatched in recorded history.

Human tragedies such as this are often met with responses of compassion, including financial, personnel and prayer resources to help those caught in the tragedy to regain some normalcy to their lives. This is the case in the Philippines where Faith Based Ministries as well as government resources from other nations have moved in to offer aid to those in need.

Recovery is a long time process. Many are on hand for immediate help. In time, however, they return to their own place and become involved once again in the work that is their regular business. The place of the tragedy is still in need and the lives impacted by the tragedy still need help and healing.

A medical team from the Silverdale area is being put in place for a mission to Visayas during the last two weeks of March, 2014. The team includes nurses and technicians who are part of the Silverdale United Methodist Church, as well as additional personnel that have volunteered from the local hospitals.

An authentic Filipino food dinner was held on December 8 to raise funds for expenses related to supplies and travel for the team. The response has been excellent and several have been very generous in providing funds for the trip. Everyone is encouraged to contribute.

Checks may be made payable to Wind of the Spirit Ministries, [WOSM], Silverdale United Methodist Church [SUMC], or Christian Bible Fellowship, [CBF], designated for Philippine Medical Mission. You will receive a receipt for your taxdeductible donation.


