VANGIE HENDRICKSON

Vangie, what initially inspired you to initiate local missions in Richmond?

God continues to use the New York City and Atlanta mission trips to spark a fire in my heart to show Jesus' unconditional love and to carry the life-transforming gospel message to those in our community. These trips have heightened my sense of urgency to love and serve those that need to know the hope and freedom we have in Christ. God uses these experiences as training ground for missions in our own backyard.

What kinds of missions and outreaches have you created?

God continues to break our hearts for what breaks His and as He does so, He reveals the limitless opportunities to serve the local community. Over the years, I have joined MCC Friends in giving our yes to local missions. What has this looked like? City prayer circles with gifts (Rose bouquets, Easter baskets, Christmas gifts, etc.) to women and children residing in the crisis shelters; Acts of Kindness (giving away flowers, balloons, cookies, candy, cards, coffee, and other surprise blessings scattered around the community); Preparing HOPE treat bags and delivering to homeless friends; Bringing joy to nursing homes and shutin families by singing Christmas carols; Hosting Extreme Makeover Outreaches in which women from the RVA community are invited for a "Princess Party" Day of pampering; Having a Summer Sno-Cone Party with the Homeless Community; Hosting a Movie Night and Vacation Bible School at an emergency shelter; and so much more! Other times, local missions has looked like praying for a friend in the gym or in the grocery store, visiting a friend in the hospital, or bringing a meal to a neighbor.

Vangie is the Director of MCC Women's Ministries. Vangie, her husband, Aaron, and children, Jonah, Abram, and Annalynn have been attending MCC since 2002.



Share a significant God moment in your experiences with local missions.

I've had the privilege to serve at the Pregnancy Resource Center of Metro Richmond since 2004. There was a 21-year-old student who had made an appointment at a local clinic. Her plan was to have an abortion. She noticed, as she approached the entrance to the facility, someone holding a poster inviting her to consider a life-affirming decision. At that moment, she had wondered, "Is that message for me?" She was prompted to look in her purse, and in it was a pharmacy bag containing a prescription she recently picked up. She picked up the bag and behold, there was an advertisement for the PRC, describing its free services for women experiencing an unplanned pregnancy. So she turned around, skipped her appointment, and visited the PRC. On that day, I had the privilege of serving this young lady. Her story was my story. That's not coincidence, rather a divine appointment. We talked. We cried. With her permission, I shared about the hope, grace, peace, and strength in Christ. We had an amazing conversation and discussed all options, however she decided that her only option is to choose parenting. I asked her to show me the PRC ad on the pharmacy bag because this was the first that I heard of this marketing strategy. When she left, I learned from the staff that at no point in their advertising history has the PRC ever posted ads on pharmacy bags. God was rewriting her story, and inviting me to be a small part of this story through a (cont.)

simple, but miraculous rewriting of words on the back of a paper bag.

How has serving this way affect your relationship with Christ?

Every 'yes' brings me closer to Christ. My faith is increased each time I see God's movement. It's a perspective-changer which prompts me not only to count my blessings, but to carry my cross with greater devotion according to His will and purposes.

Tell us something about the relationships you've formed with other volunteers.

It's a knitting of hearts. There are no words that can adequately describe what God does in the hearts of people working alongside each other for one common purpose. We operate as one unit, one family. There's tears, sweat, sacrifice, hard work, great courage, and a cost we share collectively. But on those frontlines, we have a front row view, and a privilege to witness and experience God's almighty power, presence, and victory. In those kingdom-impacting moments, God draws each of us closer to Him, and to one another.



What would you say to someone who was considering volunteering at a local ministry outreach?

It's a simple YES... a yes to "See" the need and then to "Meet" the need. There are needs all around us. Ask God to show you the need, and then ask Him how He will equip you to fulfill the need. And yes, it will cost you, but Jesus is absolutely worth it!

MATT MCQUILLAN

Matt, what initially drew you to going on mission to NYSUM?

The opportunity to step out of my comfort zone and serve far enough away from home. It's almost like a retreat, allowing me to completely let go of what is going on at home and at work, and dedicate myself to the mission.

What were your impressions of the people you encountered during your time on the mission?

The most striking thing is the number of people literally looking for someone to share Jesus with them. The fear of being rejected, while sharing Christ, has been easy to overcome when the need is so great. Though generally our teams go out to minister to an intended audience, you find the desire to know Christ is all around, not just among the homeless or those living in the shelters, but the shelter security guards, the police, and even our teammates on the mission.

Tell us something about the relationships you formed with other team members while on your mission.

There is nothing like two, five hour van rides, and a week in NYC serving, to make new best friends. My best friends at MCC have all come via the opportunity to serve on mission trips. When you are serving the Lord, with a servant's heart, God does big things on these teams, creating tight-knit friendship bonds.

Share a significant God moment in your experience on your mission.

This past May, our team was provided direction by Pastor Peter at NYSUM to get outside a shelter where the need for ministry was huge. Our team had everything working against us. It was already midnight, we had a long day, and our team was split up. While we wanted to call it a night, Pastor Peter kept calling and saying don't give up...through traffic jams, getting lost, and a long bathroom break we made it. We were greeted by about 15 homeless or shelter people. One gentleman we met was going through a rough period in his life and was ready to give his life to Christ. While our team prayed for him, he was slain in the spirit. The noises and the shriek he made while he fell to the ground was something that can only be experienced. The presence of the Lord was felt by the whole team and it's something our team will not forget.



How has your life been changed by your time at NYSUM?

My first trip to NYSUM was with MCC Christmas Compassion a little over a month after Hurricane Sandy's storm surge had devastating impacts on the metropolitan NYC area. NYSUM had partnered with Operation Blessing to provide relief teams to offer hope and help, when it is needed most, responding to immediate needs of those suffering by helping to take the first step in the marathon of recovery. Our team was assigned a work order to remove everything from the basement of a house where the waterline had reached 15'. The storm provided the opportunity to be a "ministry of presence" where we could offer aid and maybe most importantly a listening ear, and offer hope and Christ through prayer. I was so impressed with Operation Blessing I continued to follow them and participate in disaster recovery. Most recently, I reached out to Pastor Mitch about Operation Blessing's need for volunteers in Baton Rouge, Louisiana from the "1000 year flood" in September and we had a small team make the trek down. NYSUM is considered a training ground with the goal of raising up missionaries to bring something back to their home church. With Operation Blessing, I have had the opportunity to bring a little NYSUM home.

What would you say to someone who is considering going on a mission?

Take that step out of your comfort zone and go!

NIGER, AFRICA allison harper

Allison, what initially drew you to going on mission to Niger?

I had heard stories from relatives and others of their missions to Niger, Africa for about 10 years. My husband went on a LINK Mission, and when he returned, he persistently challenged me to go, despite my fear of traveling to another country and leaving our two young children. I knew I would go one day, but I thought it would not be until our children were much older. Well, that's not exactly what God had planned. Josh had wanted me to experience it as soon as possible because he knew it would change my life and our family forever. And it has.

What did you see in the people you encountered in Niger?

I always say the people of Niger are so extremely kind and welcoming. They make you feel like family from the second you meet them. I've met many Nigeriens who, despite their harsh environment, have determination and great love for one another. I also noticed the Christians living in a predominately Muslim country are very bold about their faith.

Would you share a significant God moment in your experience on your mission?

I've seen God at work in Niger in so many ways that it's hard to put them into words. On my last mission, I saw a baby being born via C-section that the doctor had pronounced dead. An EMT on our team asked if she could take the baby to their equivelant of a NICU. When we got there, she found the baby did have a heartbeat. Very quickly, she started doing what she needed to do to revive the baby, and I was able to assist her. This sweet baby would have been left on a cart, wrapped in a bundle to die, if God had not put us in the right place at the right time.

Allison, Josh, Savannah & Jacob have been a part of MCC, as a family, since 2008. Josh grew up at Mechanicsville Christian Center.



Tell us something about the relationships you formed with other team members while on your mission.

Before leaving for Niger, I hardly knew some of my teammates, and some of them are now among my best friends. After each one of my mission trips, we seem to come back more like family. When you experience something like this, it brings your relationships to a whole new level. These relationships are unique because of what you have experienced together.

How has your life been changed by the time spent on your mission?

I do things more passionately, now more than ever, in my daily life and on other mission trips. My focus is more on God and eternity rather than the right here and right now. I continually find myself talking to people about what I experienced in Niger and looking for ways to focus my time on God's will for me at home, even with all the distractions we have here in the United States.



How did your mission affect your relationship with Christ?

My whole testimony is about moving from fear to faith. I was scared of everything. I was scared to fly, I was scared to leave my children. Honestly, I was scared I would die. For weeks leading up to my first mission trip, I was thinking of ways I could get out of going. I was scared to death. I was praying God would stop the trip, and we would not have to go. Then I started praying on my hands and knees every single day, several times a day, that God would help me and tell me what to do. About a week before I left, I could not take it anymore, and I surrendered it all to God. Immediately a peace came over me, and from that very moment, I knew God was going to take care of me. From the time we left MCC, until we returned home, I never experienced one second of fear, which is unexplainable. I was not scared on the plane nor was I fearful of being in Africa, and that made me realize God was taking care of me and that I could trust Him in all circumstances.



What would you say to someone who was considering going on a mission?

Saying yes to God will change your life, and seeing how God works while in Niger will make you want to continue to say yes to God to see what He has in store next. Despite the financial challenges and people who may discourage you from going, what God will reveal to you on your mission will take your faith to the next level in fulfilling God's will for your life.
