Dear Friend,

He said something to the effect: One of the problems in the modern Church is we have forgotten that after the "Narrow Gate," there is a "Narrow Way."

Now like I said, this should be common sense to believers but how many of us live like we have no real boundaries except for what we desire? How will we find our weakness unless we try in the amount of strength that we do possess? Some people are VERY STRONG! But that strength is paltry compared to the awesome strength of Almighty God. These are just a few thoughts I have had recently. I went through a time of attack in my body unlike anything I have ever experienced. In that time, I rested, prayed, sought God, fasted (no choice there, I could not eat), and reflected. God had my full and undivided attention.
