Key Convictions

Gospel Centered – The central characteristic of UBC is an unwavering commitment to the Gospel. The Gospel is consistently proclaimed in the weekly services and in the lives of the members. It is a clear expectation that everyone associated with UBC has an opportunity to hear the Gospel and be encouraged to share the Gospel. I Corinthians 15:1-11

Biblically Guided – We consult the Scriptures and submit to them in all things that we do. We pursue doctrinal integrity to the best of our ability by seeing the Word of God as authoritative and living and active. 2 Timothy 3:14-17

Prayer Driven – UBC strives to be a *praying* church in all aspects of service. We seek to acknowledge that God leads us in all things. Consequently, prayer is essential to who we are and is a core part of our identity. Ephesians 6:18-20

Emphasis on Fasting—Complements and accentuates prayer. Fasting is a physical and holistic response to help facilitate our prayers. Fasting and prayer spotlights God's freedom that sets prisoners free, provides justice and community. Isaiah 58

Discipleship Focused – Ministry efforts at UBC are anchored in the core principles of discipleship. As seen in the Great Commission, we are committed to *go make disciples*. We seek to take Gospel to the lost and not wait for the lost to come find us. We pray earnestly for a movement of God that leads to salvation and *baptisms* among the lost. We also commit to *teaching* our church family *to obey all that He has commanded*. In short, this means we are a church that makes disciples who make disciples. Some practical implications include:

We seek to integrate practical expressions of discipleship in every ministry area of the church. Our ministries are evaluated on their ability to effectively make disciples.

A church committed to church planting as the chief expression of church growth. We are not driven by numerical attendance and increasing the church budget. Rather, the answer for growth will be planting new churches in key communities when appropriate. The focus is empowering new congregations to be self-sufficient as a result of effective discipleship at UBC.

Church staff and church members are consistently challenged to personally engage in intentional relationships of discipleship, especially those that target the lost. Our goal is taking the gospel to all people.

UBC is a missional church. We seek to be witnesses of the Gospel in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and the ends of the earth. Over time our goal would be for UBC to be a launching pad for missional endeavors in our immediate community and around the world. (Matthew 28:18-20; Psalm 67; Acts 2:41, 47)

Families Valued – Families are a priority for UBC. We are a church for every stage of life and a church that emphasizes the importance of family.

Pastoral Care – UBC is a place where people are loved and cared for when they face times of difficulty and hardship. The congregation shares in this responsibility so that people are loved by their church.

Spiritual Worship – The key theological message of worship is one that adheres to the truths found in Romans 12. Specifically, worship is much more than a weekly expression of a genre of music but a way of life. It is found in a renewed mind and offering ourselves as living sacrifices. UBC seeks to stress this truth in every capacity. (Romans 12:1-2)

Holistic Giving - We seek to be a church that gives sacrificially, generously and cheerfully. Rather than emphasizing a financial formula we cultivate an atmosphere where everyone is encouraged to surrender not only their finances to God but all other areas of life as well. As Paul encourages the church in Corinth, we seek to excel in faith, speech, knowledge, earnestness in love as well as the grace of giving.

A Loving Community – UBC is a place for all people. We seek to love everyone who comes through those doors no matter their gender, race, age, ethnicity, socio-economic status or any other delineation by which an individual can be defined. UBC will be a place where all people can come and be well loved. (1 John 4:7-12)



UNIVERSITY BAPTIST CHURCH—WHERE WE ARE

University Baptist Church (UBC) is located at 2720 Wabash Avenue, Fort Worth, TX, 76109. We are just across the street from the Texas Christian University (TCU) campus. The doors of our Sanctuary open out to the north side of the campus.





The church campus is currently comprised of:

- Sanctuary—Opened in 1974; 10,000 square feet; 800 person capacity
- Education Building—Opened in 1957 (addition 1967); 63,000 square feet
- Chapel—Opened in 1951; 4,100 square feet; 200 person capacity

The church has additional properties including four residences (close proximity to church), a vacant lot across from church parking lot, and two mission properties - Luz del Mundo (5024 Townsend) and Mision de Paz (2805 and 2813 Sappington). In addition, an apartment is rented to provide Bible study and homework tutoring at the Morningside Apartments (2900 South Freeway).

Along with being neighbors with TCU, just to the west of our campus is Alice Carlson Applied Learning Center, a Fort Worth Independent School District School of Choice elementary school (K-5). Other school campuses within a two mile radius are Kinderfrogs and Starpoint, TCU laboratory schools for Pre-K—6th Grade; Lily B. Clayton, Tanglewood, and Westcliff elementary schools; Daggett and McLean middle schools; and Paschal High School.

Demographic Information (two mile radius of UBC):

- Currently there are 53,249 persons residing in the area.
- Population is projected to grow 3.2% (1708 persons) between 2015-2020.

- The racial/ethnic diversity of the area is considered high. Among individual groups, Anglos represent 53.2% of the population and all other racial/ethnic groups make up 46.8% which is above the national average of 38%. The largest of these groups, Hispanics/Latinos accounts for 38.7% of the total population. Native-American/Others are projected to be the fastest growing group increasing by 13.4% between 2015 and 2020.
- Area household concerns which are likely to exceed the national average finding a
 good church, finding spiritual teaching, achieving educational objectives, and achieving a
 fulfilling marriage.

UNIVERSITY BAPTIST CHURCH—WHO WE ARE

Since its beginning in 1929, University Baptist Church (UBC) has been focused on carrying out the Great Commission. 1929 marked the beginning of the Great Depression and the year UBC's charter members decided the Texas Christian University (TCU) area needed an evangelical witness. This holds true today. Consequently, the church continues to identify itself as *University* Baptist Church.

Church growth has ebbed and flowed throughout an 86-year-old ministry. Three <u>UBC</u> <u>Heritage videos</u>, located on our website, ubcforworth.org, provide more information on our former pastors and historical development as a church.
