

When I first started getting really involved in church as a kid, I know this was one of the most terrifying phrases that I could possibly hear. There is no prerequisite for the class or any individual lesson for that matter. The Bible is our primary text, and the only outside information will come from handouts and charts that I provide. So, if the Sprit has called out to you that this is something you need in your life consider this affirmation that you are not alone. I hope to see some new faces join us this fall in whom the Sprit is stirring.
