Graceson has accepted our offer to be our Interim Minister. A graduate of Wesley Theological Seminary, Rev. Graceson most recently served as the Associate Pastor at Immanuel Presbyterian Church in McLean, Virginia.

A coal miner's daughter from Eastern Kentucky, Pastor Susan has lived in the DC area since the age of 13. Susan is an ordained ruling elder and has served local churches as educator, pulpit supply preacher, retreat leader, and worship coordinator. She volunteers for a number of social service organizations and Presbytery committees. In her spare time, she enjoys travel, writing, crafts and hanging out with her two cats. Susan and her husband David live in Falls Church with their young adult sons, Sammy and Carter.

In the Presbyterian church, an Interim Minister typically leads a congregation while they search for a permanent Minister – a process that can take up to a couple years. Rev. Graceson will begin as the Interim Pastor September 1, 2020. CCPC's previous pastor, Rev. James Brassard, retired earlier this year after serving CCPC for 16 years.

Reopening Task Force Message

We know that everyone is missing the joy of worshiping together. It hurts to not be able to see each other and give one another the hugs we used to share. Covid 19 has required CCPC to learn to worship and work together in ways we never wanted or imagined. This virus is new, highly contagious, and deadly. According to all the science the only way to stop the spread of this disease is by staying apart. Our church is located in one of the hot spots of the nation. Since things have been opening up in our area, we are seeing a rise in cases and hospitalizations. The task force is watching these numbers closely. It is our opinion that opening our building or calling any large assembly of people together currently is much too risky. The chance of spreading this deadly disease is a very real threat. It is our recommendation that CCPC remain closed for in-person gatherings for now. There may be exceptions made for small personal gatherings such as a memorial service or wedding.

The reality is that we must learn how to work and worship together in new and different ways during this pandemic. We are still God's people doing our best to do God's work. We all owe a great deal of thanks to Justin for his leadership and being the glue that has held us together. We are excited that a new interim pastor has been chosen and will soon be joining us in this new journey

The reopening task force is looking for your ideas and suggestions. This is new and uncharted territory. There is not a right answer. We can only make the best decision we can with the information available to us today. We need to weigh the threat of Covid 19 against our personal need to be together. Church cannot be as it was. We cannot have live singing. We cannot have any physical contact. We must wear face masks. We must practice social distancing. How do we keep our congregation safe?

We solicit your ideas and suggestions on how we can safely reopen our campus. How can we be a more effective church community working together, just a little further apart?

Race & Diversity Task Force Digital Retreat!

In June, Session authorized a task force to consider our response to the racial injustice that has led to worldwide protests this year. Since then, the Race & Diversity Task Force (RDTF) has met four times, via zoom, to not only increase our understanding of the depth and reach of the problem, but also to identify how we can improve our ability to share the love of Christ with people of color in our congregation and community. Our first effort is a **digital retreat** to create a safe place to discuss our increasing awareness of the problems of systemic racism.

Join us **August 21-23** for Courageous Conversations on Race, Diversity, and Loving One Another .

We will kick off the weekend with a movie watch party on Friday night with a follow-up conversation about the documentary, *13th*, analyzing the history that has led us to be the worldleader in mass incarceration. On Saturday, we'll meet in two zoom sessions with breakout groups to share our questions and concerns about racial justice. Our worship service on Sunday will flow out of those Courageous Conversations.

To facilitate our digital retreat, we welcome the expertise of Carlesa Finney, who among many other qualifications, served ten years with Dr. Kevin Maxwell on the Anne Arundel CountyPublic Schools school board and eight years as the Executive Director of the Office of Equity and Human Relations.
