When we spread and go still, we are carried by the largest sea of all: the sea of grace that flows steadily beneath the turmoil of events. And just as fish can't see the ocean they live in we can't quite see the spirit that sustains us." Nepo suggests that, if possible, we spend time near a lake or pond this fall, and watch the leaves that float on the surface of the water as a reminder that we, too, are carried by a spirit that we cannot see.



### Alternative Christmas Market!






Register for Fall 2020 Pathways Online Courses at Union Presbyterian Seminary Courses open to all
