

Session Update

Pastor Susan introduced Lillie Thomas II, who was warmly received by session members. Lillie explained her education history and her previous responsibilities. Her vision for youth ministry includes camaraderie, growth in relationship to God, and community involvement with justice.

A Congregational Meeting has been called for Sunday, May 9, so that Wendall Aylevie and Dan MacMillan may be voted in as elders to fill vacant positions.

A memorial service for Pastor James Brassard has been scheduled for Saturday, October 30, 2021, at the church. A memorial service for Nancy Sandford has been scheduled for June 20, 2021, in the Memorial Garden. A service for Peter Ebot is pending.

Sharon and Stanley Dixon have transferred their membership to Eastminster Presbyterian Church in South Carolina.

The Worship Committee hopes that the church will open for in-person worship August first. This service will also include Facebook Live, which will also be available for August 8th. If all goes well with the new equipment, live streaming will begin August 15th.

The CAT scan team is hard at work collecting initial data. This is the first step in the process to search for a new pastor.

Evonne Tang, Finance Committee Chair, adjusted the budget figures to include \$11,000 for equipment, which brings the 2021 budget figure to \$468,930. Cyd Radden LeSage has filed all the paperwork in hopes that CCPC might qualify for a second PPP loan. Purchase streamlining and the possibility of credit card use by church staff is in process with the Finance Committee.

The Race and Diversity Committee holds podcasts on Fridays at 6:30; next is Unearased, stories of men who underwent conversion therapy for homosexuality. Matthew 25 book discussions – Summer: Microagressions in Ministry; Fall: White Too Long, Winter: Outside the Lines. The committee is exploring More Light resources for future use. The Fair Youth Sentencing Law, which the committee endorsed, will take effect in October. The next focus will be the Emmitt Till Antilynching Law.

Session approved the BCNS request to hold a spring yard sale in the church parking lot on a Saturday in May. They will use social distancing and clean up afterwards. The sanctuary, meeting rooms, hallway, narthex and bathrooms have been deep cleaned and sanitized by the Building and Grounds Committee.

Memorial Brick Ceremony!

The Memorial Brick Ceremony will be held in the Memorial Garden at Noon on Sunday, October 31.

The deadline for brick orders is Wednesday, June 30.

Please note this is a strict deadline and cannot be extended due to the process of ordering the bricks, getting them made, shipping, and set into the memorial walkway.
