For those that like their theology in a more enjoyable form, I recommend you attend one of this week's performances of "The Children of Eden." This musical makes those first chapters of Genesis come alive in a way that both children and adults will appreciate. Linda Miller and Susan Ricci Rogel have attracted a great cast and crew. June 30th: In 2 Kings, we hear of the great prophet Elijah's passing on his mantle to the next generation. In Luke 9:51-62, we find Jesus setting his face towards Jerusalem. 
