# The cross that was saved....

Gordon Ebersole of Bowie, gets frustrated sometimes because the world isn't more self sufficient.

When the 15-foot tall cross had to be removed from the roof of the Christian Community Presbyterian Church at 3120 Belair Rd. and was going to be discarded because of how costly it would be to re-erect it, the 80-year-old Ebersole stepped in.

After a contractor had estimated it could be expensive to erect the angle-iron, I-beam cross in the memorial garden of the church, church members voted to get rid of it because of the expense involved, Ebersole said.

"I guess the contractor was somewhat realistic," Ebersole added, a little grudgingly. "He was going to bring in a crane."

The cross weighs more than two hundred pounds and required three men to lift it to the memorial garden. Ebersole used block and

The cross weighs more than two hundred pounds and required three men to lift it to the memorial garden. Ebersole used block and tackle and cable to erect the cross in the garden, and cemented it in place — all for the cost of an \$8 bag of concrete.

"I only used about two-thirds of the bag of concrete," Ebersole said. "So, it really only cost about





Dear CCPC Members & Friends,

The rumors are correct, the Building Committee is alive and well and it is back in the swing of the planning for erecting the sanctuary. Over the past few months we have been encouraged by the continued rate of pledge fulfillment (Building funds stand at about \$400,000) and the potential availability of construction loans.

Within the past month, the committee has taken a series of steps to move the project along as quickly as possible. We submitted several applications to loan institutions and found a modest interest. One concern we received in feedback was the high cost per square footage of the sanctuary. We carefully reviewed some comparative data and concluded that we would probably do better with a competitive bid. Hence, we have paid off the pre-construction contract (\$20,252) with Scott-Long Construction. They have transferred all appropriate drawings and documents to the Kerns Group, our

At the committee's most recent meeting, Tom Kerns, the architect, met with us to architects. review the schedule and timetable. First, he will be reactivating our permit through, he hopes, a simple re-instatement rather than a re-submittal. He is preparing revisions to the specifications, and incorporating information from Scott-Long Construction. This package will be completed by the end of the year and submitted to a select bid list of six to ten general contractors.
