The Biblical lessons for the four weeks of Advent don't tell the story the way we would want. Rather than give a straight forward narrative from Old Testament prophecy to our Saviors birth in Bethlehem, the Bible readings hopscotch around Luke's gospel with carefree abandon. In fact, the story gets told backwards, beginning with Jesus' predictions about the end of the age. We finally get around to Mary's pregnancy the fourth week. Advent messes with our sense of time.

In the introduction to New Testament class in seminary, we are told there are two Greek words we translate as time. One is chronos, and it names a kind of time with which we count and track everyday events in our lives. It is time measured in minutes and seconds and days. It is mundane, ordinary time and we all know how it beats on relentlessly. Chronos is the time of history or in our digital age "real time."

There is another kind of time at play in the imagination of the gospel writers. It is captured by the Greek word Kairos. This is God's time and it punctures through the mundane clock of our lives at unexpected intervals. Kairos moments are those instances when we catch a glimpse of God.

Christmas is a time when we all hope to catch a glimpse of the life we want God to give us. That is why the holiday is so difficult for so many people. Christmas has a way of bringing human brokenness to the surface. Siblings that haven't spoken in decades, parents mourning children lost in every conceivable way, and neighborhoods reeling from racial injustice, all this seems to surface at Christmas time. If you follow the cartoon series "Sally Forth," Ted visits his family at Thanksgiving and Christmas. Ted, who is pretty strange, is still the healthiest of the four boys in his family. Each Thanksgiving and Christmas, Ted and his family travel to the family home in hopes of a better reception. But soon his juvenile brothers pick on him. His Dad, who is incompetent as a father and a husband, throws out a few very hurtful remarks and then retreats to his garage. Meanwhile, his mother continues to live in oblivion. But Ted keeps coming back stealing himself to not react to the slights and to try to mend the brokenness and hurt. He is hoping to catch a glimpse of God's redemption. Will this be the year?

In Advent we try to help everyone discover the hope they need at this particular moment in your life. Like the gospel readings, our lives are a mishmash of past, present, and a hoped for, or in some cases, dreaded,

future. Everything comes together when we arrive on Christmas Eve. I like how the carol says it, "The hopes and fears of all the years are met in thee tonight."

In an effort to help our children and new families participate more fully in the story of Jesus' birth, we have made some changes to our 6:00 PM Christmas Eve family service. There will be a Children's Sermon by Justin; he plans to read a poem he has written in the spirit of "The Night Before Christmas." The children will also be teaching the congregation a song that they have been learning in Children's Church. Then, instead of sending the children out to eat a birthday cake for Jesus, we are adding some dramatic elements to the Christmas homily. We will sing carols that are upbeat and familiar to children. We can expect that many joyful noises will be made while having the children in for the entire service. The service will run around 50 minutes and will now include a candle lighting ceremony. We have ordered 50 battery powered electric "candles" for the children. We will trust adults with the real wax version.

We are also offering a Youth and Children's Christmas Play at the 10:30 AM service on December 20th. The play is titled, "A Rock and Roll Nativity." The play will feature music from the 70s, 80s, 90s, and 2000s; from artists such as the Goo Goo Dolls, Bon Jovi, and Styx. The Children and

Youth have been practicing very hard and we are hoping for a great turnout for that Sunday! Justin will be giving a short sermon titled "WWYD".

Susan has also planned special Christmas music that starts at 10:15 AM and a reception for Kathryn and Dave McCarty will follow the service. It is going to be a great day!

A reminder to parents: our Red clad visitor from the North Pole will arrive after the 10:30 AM service on

December 13th. The kids who are practicing for the play will be let out in small groups to sit on the jolly old man's lap for pictures. Also, throughout the season, we will also be

adding some new Advent hymns and a few new Christmas carols. All of the tunes are familiar. I hope these changes will provide opportunities for God to break into your life and bless you in new and unexpected ways.

**December 13th**: Jesus had a favorite Old Testament prophet: Isaiah. Isaiah writes about hope. Advent is mostly about hope. Hope is about something unexpected reviving us, something fresh and new. What do you hope for at Christmas?



We are delighted to have a musical program provided for us by some very talented young CCPC women. You won't want to miss this opportunity for food, fellowship and entertainment!




Adult Education Classes
