Parenting Class Sign-up Announcement

The Adult Education Council proposes to offer a class on parenting to families with children from pre-school thru high school.

Our proposal is to have someone in the membership lead a discussion of parents using widely-accepted parenting books as the basis for discussion among parents in the class.

One book is "Parenting with Love and Logic: Teaching Children Responsibility" by Forest Cline and Jim Fay. And we also have other books to use as reference.

The book offers some basic principles of parenting, then addresses 48 specific areas that often give parents a challenge.

The areas include TV and video games, school, the Internet, "I'm bored", homework, chores, fighting, keeping the room clean.

Does this list rouse your curiosity as to what the other 40 areas are?

We are not sure of the interest in such a class or when it would be best offered (Sunday mornings or some other time during the week). We will arrange for child care during the class for those who need it.

To gauge the interest we will have a table set up in the Atrium before and after worship service on 26 August and 2 September to provide you the opportunity to ask questions and look over the book. Or you may call me at your convenience.

If interested, we ask you to "sign up". We are looking for a half dozen families or more to commit to the class in order to proceed with its development.

Sunday Morning Schedule
