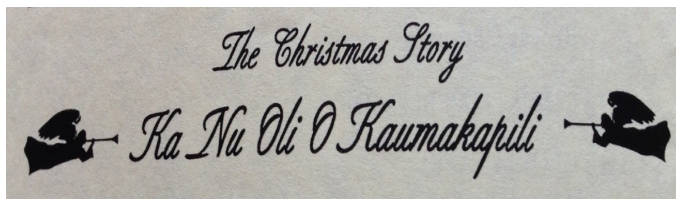
Ke Kahu Kahikolu

In 1995, Kaumakapili launched Ke Kahu Kahikolu, a new idea for pastoral leadership, by using a team of spiritual leaders. This team was made up of three kahu - thus Kahikolu/Three in One, a trilogy of Kahikealoha/One in Love, Kahikamana'o/One in Thought, and Kahipu'uwai/One in Heart. Kahu Mua David Kaupu, Kahu Hope Kaleo Patterson, Lae'ula Kordell Kekoa and later Lae'ula Sherman Thompson, together as Kahu Kahikolu, shared duties of a single, full-time pastor. Kahu Kaupu as senior pastor was assisted by Kahu Patterson, caring for administrative and spiritual leadership, while Kordell Kekoa from 1995-1999 and Sherman Thompson from 1999-2003 served as youth ministers.

Key factors of Kahu Kahikolu were to encourage the church to remember where we came from, an immersion into Kaumakapili's history much forgotten, and likewise, to infuse the rich language and culture that is part of the Hawaiian psyche with the gospel and teaching of Bible truths as we see today. Apana Bible studies became a valuable outreach to the community of believers when Kahu Kahikolu spent evenings in families' homes from Waimanalo to Waianae in fellowship with those living within each area.



Kahu Kahikolu occurred during a time of growth for Kaumakapili – spiritual growth as well as physical. Kaumakapili celebrated its 160th anniversary year. During the Christmas Eve service December 24, 1998, the Historical Pageant titled “Ka Nu Oli O Kaumakapili” became the focal point of the service, uplifting the richness of Hawaii's history, the coming of the missionaries and the establishment of Kaumakapili Church in 1838.

When you visit someone's home for the first time, doesn't it make you feel closer to them, like you really know them better? Last month 2 members of Kaumakapili (myself and Claudie Na'auao) and 3 members of our 2018 Interim Ministry team (Kahu Randy Furushima, Kona Mann and Helen Kaupu Ka'owili) and 47 others mostly from Hawaii had that experience in Israel. Kahu Randy organized the tour with 5 days in Galilee and Samaria and 5 days in Jerusalem. The scriptures really came alive during our daily devotions, making us feel closer to Jesus in our daily walk with Him. We visited the Mount of the Beatitudes where Jesus gave the sermon on the mount, sailed on the Sea of Galilee, and saw Caesarea Philippi where Peter confessed Jesus as the Christ. To me it was surprising how much water and farming there is in Galilee. Our local guide (Jackie Feldman) was an anthropologist who made us realize how much geography and resources determine history, and clarified which sites had scientific evidence to support their claims and which locations were matters of faith. In Jerusalem, every place was astounding. Highlights included the garden of Gethsemane, Temple Mount and the Garden Tomb where we had a communion service using olive wood cups. This was truly an experience of a lifetime!

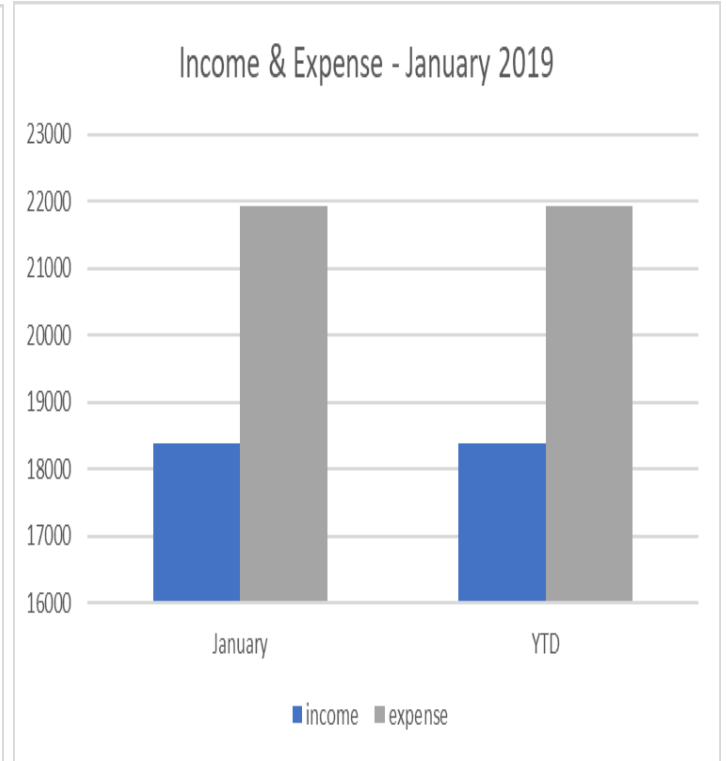
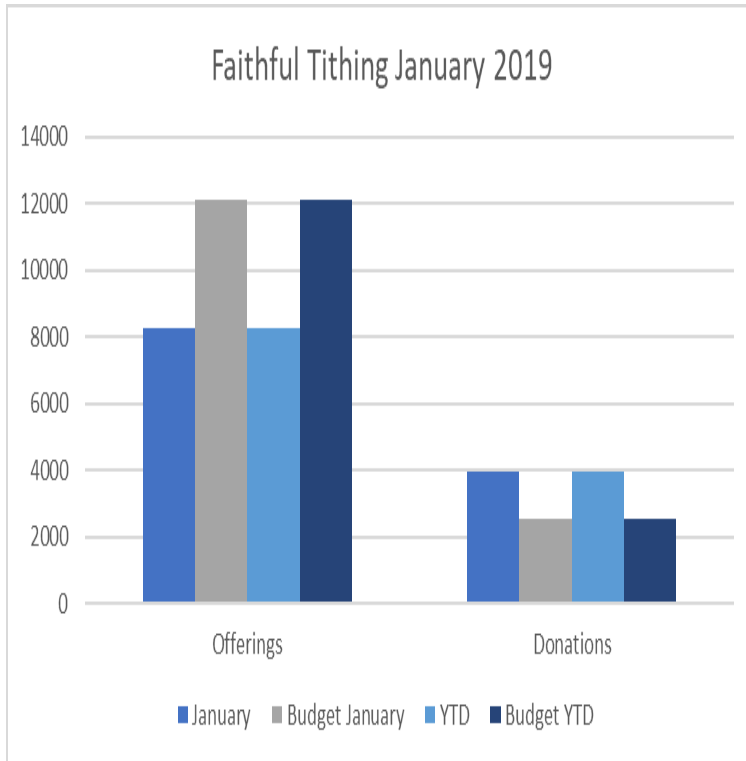
