

Kaumakapili - Calendar of Events!!

No Longer A Stranger

"Hoʻokahi nō lā o ka malihini, a lilo ʻo ia i hoa kamaʻāina." You arrived a stranger, and now you are family.

"Hui, howzit! Come As a child, I recall visitors, familiar or unfamiliar, coming to our home. No previous phone call was needed. They were greeted by my father, invited in with pleasure and offered hospitality. We keiki would serve the makua and kupuna and never run around wild in their presence.

Today, we live in a different era. We think twice before letting just anyone in. We bolt the doors of our homes. We go to work, school and other activities for long hours every day.

So our abode, instead of being a place of welcome and inclusion, becomes our own quiet haven, protecting us from the hustle and bustle of today's violence and people who do not share our loina - values, cultural principles and experiences.

In her book Change We Must: My Spiritual Journey, Nana Veary, a respected kupuna and spiritualist, affirmed for me nā loina (values, traditions) of aloha and ho'okipa (compassion and hospitality).

custom of our people. She was quick to offer a passerby a quenching drink, a little something to eat, cordial conversation and even a place to sleep if needed. As a young girl, Aunty Nana recalled questioning her tūtū about why she would ho'okipa and be so kind to any malihini (stranger).

She never forgot her tūtū's reply, "A'ole au i hānai aku nei i ke kanaka, akā, hānai i ka 'uhane a ke Akua i loko ona." Meaning, "I was not feeding the man; I was entertaining the spirit of God within him."


For Nana Veary, this forever framed her worldview and the meaning of "aloha" as a recognition of the divine in everyone.
