Do you have an extra hour a week? Would you enjoy volunteering for the FISH Food Bank on a regular schedule? If so we have two different volunteer opportunities you might enjoy becoming involved with:

Rosauers Fresh Alliance Pickup on Wednesdays:

We are currently looking for a volunteer who would be willing to go to Rosauers each **Wednesday** between about 9:00 or 9:30 AM (flexible time) to pick up the food they donate to FISH. Rosauers puts the food in tubs, so you go to the back of the store and place the tubs in your vehicle. The food is then taken to the Hood River FISH Site and the volunteers help unload your car. It does require some lifting and you do need a vehicle you would be able to place the tubs. They are usually at least 4 or so tubs. It usually only takes about ½ hour and we can always find a substitute if you plan to be gone, so it is not as if you can never leave town.

Mid-Valley FISH "Set-Up" Volunteer for Thursdays:

The second volunteer opportunity is to work as a team member to prepare the Mid-Valley FISH site for the distribution, each Thursday morning starting about 10:00. In this position you work with another volunteer to stock shelves, fill the food bins and straighten up the site. It usually takes only about 1 hour to an hour and half. In this position you do have to be able to move food around, usually only light lifting. Once again if you need to be out of town, we always have some to fill in.

Linda Riggs is currently doing the Mid-Valley set-up and was working with Hollis Dunlop our volunteer from the Jesuit Volunteer Corps; Hollis completed her year of service and we now need another team member to help Linda. If you have an extra 1 ½ hours to give to FISH and would like to help with the set-up of the Mid-Valley Site, please contact Billie Stevens at 541-490-5109.
