# Safe Families for Children: Supporting Families

Meet Melina and her three children (ages 3, 4, and 7) Melina learned she needed brain surgery, requiring up to a week's stay in the hospital. Less than a year ago, she moved to RI, away from a domestic violence situation. Her family lived far away and unable to help, and only one close friend lived nearby. Overwhelmed, Melina didn't have enough support to care for her children while she was in the hospital or during recovery.

God used Bethany Christian Service's Safe Families for Children (SFFC) to wrap three church communities around Melina and her children, preventing the need to use the state foster care system, which is costly and could have taken more than two weeks for Melina's children to return home. The oldest child stayed with Melina's close friend while the other two children stayed with two different SSFC host families. The family who hosted the 3 year old kept in close contact with Melina, visiting her in the hospital, talking to her every day on the phone, and stays in touch with her even now. Other people in the church communities provided coaching support, necessary winter clothing, food, and meals during Melina's recovery. When Melina's children returned home after two weeks, another church community offered help with daytime childcare, meals and friendship.

I will never forget Melina's words to me: "Julie, I am not alone anymore. I never knew God would love me so much through so many wonderful people." This is why I believe in SFFC as it is truly a partnership ministry that brings healing, hope, and connection to the body of Christ.

# Giving Hope to At-risk Youth

Straight Ahead Ministries, a long-time partner of NEC, *walks with juvenile offenders* through every step of their journey. They begin in lock-up, and continue through reentry, *providing structure and support to help* at-risk youth through the critical transition into their communities. Straights Ahead helps them develop the skills and character that will see them through each step of their *journey of faith*.

**MENTOR**: Volunteer <u>4</u> hours per month to mentor at-risk youth. *All training provided by Straight Ahead Ministries*.
